Description: 14-foot aluminium Scout boat with a flat bottom reinforced with fiberglass for optimal protection. Capacity of 330 kilograms or 725 pounds. The boat has been modified by hand to add a central steering wheel. There is also a new roll bar not installed. Johnson engine with jet propulsion 18 forces. Handcrafted boat trailer with lights and manual winch.

11.3 Minor Derogation – Lot 2 196 917

This minor derogation consists of confirming the presence of a residence built in 1985 at 11.71 metres from the front lot line whereas the by-law requires a minimum of 12 metres from the front line

WHEREAS the present request respects the urban plan

WHEREAS the use is authorized

WHEREAS the lot is mostly composed of floor zone and watercourse

WHEREAS the construction is in conformity with the regulations

WHEREAS the present request does not affect the enjoyment of the property rights of the neighboring buildings since the neighbors are at a good distance

WHEREAS a cadastral reform was carried out in 2004 and could have affected the width of the right-of-way bringing the house closer to the front lot line

WHEREAS a building permit application was granted in 1985 by Richard Leblanc authorizing construction more than 20m from the street

11.5 Application under the Permits and Certificates Restriction By-law No. 201 – Lot 2 196 753

The Urbanism Consulting Committee held a meeting on June 20, 2022, to analyze a

request for the construction of a single-family residence within the 20 meter steep slope protection strip requiring a geotechnical analysis.

FILE: Restriction on the issuance of permits or certificates due to certain constraints for lot 2 196 753 on behalf of Mr. Mario Goulard (residence in the steep slope protection strip)

Background and nature of the request:

- First, we received an application from Mr. Goulard for the construction of a new residence on de la Falaise Street.
- Upon verification, his residence is within the requested steep slope protection strip.
- Therefore, for the construction of the residence, we need a geotechnical analysis to show us that any proposed construction will not add weight to the slope and thus create future landslides or other.
- I informed the owners of the process to follow (geotechnical analysis, implementation plan, etc.).
- Subsequently, the owners requested a geotechnical analysis from Me. Amin Moeini, engineer for Groupe GÉOS inc. He does not see any problem with the stability of the slope but requires that the water be managed by infiltration and not by discharge to avoid creating erosion and soil loss.

UCC ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS, this application complies with the Urbanism plan

WHEREAS the use is permitted

WHEREAS the land is largely composed of steep slopes

WHEREAS the restriction is on the main building

WHEREAS the other setbacks of the main building are respected

WHEREAS the present request does not affect the enjoyment of the property rights of the neighboring buildings since the neighbors are at a good distance and the report confirms that there will be no impact on them

WHEREAS the geotechnical analysis shows that the soil is stable and that there is no risk of landslides on the future construction

WHEREAS the construction project is in conformity with the regulations

WHEREAS a certificate of conformity of the work will be given to us by the engineer who did the geotechnical expertise after the work

AND UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED:

TO approve the permit request for Lot 2 196 753 of the official register of Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier to confirm the issuance of the permit for the construction of a single-family house in the steep slope protection zone, and this, as recommended by the UCC.

11.6 Resolution to authorize the parking of recreational vehicles for a public event

WHEREAS a Country Dance Festival will be held on July 15 and 16 on the Municipal grounds

WHEREAS some recreational vehicles were supposed to park on private property, but due to the Avian Flu on the territory of the Municipality it is impossible to allow this
