9.2 Result of bids for the sale by public tender of the water rescue boat

As the Municipality has acquired a new water rescue boat and the old boat and trailer were put up for sale by public tender to the citizens for a starting price of \$3,700.00. The public tender notice was mailed throughout the territory

Only one bid was received from Mr. Normand McKinley in the amount of \$4,500.00 dated August 11th, 2022. The transfer of the trailer was made with the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec and the cheque was cashed.

Description: 14-foot aluminium Scout boat with a flat bottom reinforced with fiberglass for optimal protection. Capacity of 330 kilograms or 725 pounds. The boat has been modified in an artisanal way to add a central steering wheel. There is also a new roll bar not installed. Johnson engine with jet propulsion 18 forces. Homemade boat trailer with lights and manual winch.

9.3 Resolution regarding the signing of the service agreement with the Next Generation 9-1-1 Authority (9-1-1PG)

WHEREAS the Next Generation 9-1-1 Service (as defined below) replaces the Enhanced Service ("9-1-1 E") and is based on Internet Protocol ("IP") technologies and support end-to-end IP native 9-1-1 calls

AND WHEREAS the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (the "CRTC") determined in Telecom Decision CRTC 2015-531 that Canada's 9-1-1 PG system should implement the National Emergency Number Association standard (the "NENA i3 standard")

AND WHEREAS, in June 2017, the CRTC filed Telecom Regulatory Policy CRTC 2017-182, which, among other things, directs all incumbent local exchange carriers ("ILECs") to establish their next generation 9-1-1 networks through 9-1-1 network service providers

AND WHEREAS Bell operates and manages a Next Generation 9-1-1 system serving the provinces in which it is the ILEC and acting, upon request of an incumbent small exchange carrier ("ILEC"), as the 9-1-1 network provider of such ILEC, including in the territory in which the 9-1-1 authority operates

11.3 Minor Derogation – Lot 5 098 508

This Minor Derogation consists of confirming the inclination of a house already built with an angle of more than 180 degrees in relation to the street whereas the by-law allows an inclination of 30 degrees in relation to the street

WHEREAS the residence will be located more than 100 meters from the street

WHEREAS the nearest neighbor is more than 100 meters from the residence

WHEREAS the construction is in compliance with the by-law

WHEREAS the residence will not be seen from 5th Avenue

WHEREAS this is an error by the Municipality

WHEREAS all the neighbors in the area are inclined in this way in order to face their residence

WHEREAS the impact of the derogation on the neighbourhood is minimal

AND UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED:

TO approve this request for Minor Derogation for Lot 5 098 508 of the official register of Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier to allow the inclination of a house already built at an angle of more than 180 degrees to the street whereas the regulation allow a 30-degree inclination to the street.

THAT the Municipality assume the administration costs for this minor derogation since it is an error made by the Municipality when issuing the construction permit.
