

Zoning By-law #148

11.3 OUTDOOR STORAGE OF FIREWOOD

The outdoor storage of firewood for non-commercial purposes (personal use for the main building) is permitted on land where a residential building is erected. This storage must meet all of the following conditions:

- a) The wood shall be properly piled and stacked and cannot at any time be left in a loose pile in the yard except for a continuous period not exceeding 30 days;
- b) The storage shall be situated in the side or rear yard, respecting a minimum distance of 2 meters (6.6 ft.) from property lines, unless an opaque fence or hedge is built in accordance with this By-law. The maximum height of the fence is 2 meters (6.6 ft.);
- c) The storage must not obstruct a window, door or exit, nor be located under these;
- d) The maximum height for this storage is 2 meters (6.6 ft.).

Shelters for firewood (regulation available at the Municipality) can be located on a plot where a residential building is erected in accordance with this By-law.

The outdoor storage of firewood is allowed on vacant land located in a zone that is not residential. The wood must be stored properly, piled and stacked to a maximum height of 2 meters (6.6 ft.) and comply with the implantation standards prescribed in the said zone.


11.4 OUTDOOR STORAGE AND STORAGE OF LEISURE VEHICLES

The outdoor storage of recreational vehicles such as a trailer (motorized or not), tent trailer, snowmobile, motorcycle, watercraft or yacht is allowed on a lot where a residential building is erected, with the following conditions:

- a) Must be located in the side yard or rear yard, at a distance of 2 meters (6.6 ft.) of the lateral and back lines, if impossible, may be located partly in the front yard, with 2 meters (6.6 ft.) minimum lateral lines without encroaching more than 2 meters (6.6 ft.) on the front yard, measured from the front wall of the building used as a residential dwelling (see FIG 4);
- b) For vehicles, they must be in working order and have a license allowing them to travel on the road, trail or water for the year.

Snowmobiles, watercrafts, motorcycles or other recreational vehicles shall be stored inside a building and not be visible from the street during the respective offseason in Quebec.

BY-LAW #166 CONCERNING CULVERTS, PRIVATE ENTRIES AND DRIVEWAYS AND DRAINAGE

This By-law has been in effect since June 2010

The purpose of this By-law is to:

- Insure uniformity of structures
- Avoid erosion of private entries to ditches and to public roads
- reduce the load of surface water directed to public infrastructures (roads and ditches)

The main guidelines of this By-law are the following:

 Permits and a deposit guarantee are required for any new access from an existing public street, modification or reconstruction of pre-existing access

- Specific standards for construction
- Prohibition to direct runoff towards the street or ditch (Quebec Civil Code, Art. 979)
- Only a foundation drain can be connected to the dich
- No rain gutter or sub pump may discharge into the municipal right of way

PORTABLE SPEED DISPLAY

In order to raise the population's awareness of the dangers associated with speeding, the Municipality has purchased a portable speed display. This apparatus will be placed in alternating locations throughout the territory. The display

unit registers data concerning the recorded speeds and the Municipality sends this data to the Sûreté du Québec in order to target and increase monitoring in areas where speed limits are exceeded. At the same time, we invite you, dear citizens, to reduce your speed while driving for the welfare and safety of everyone!



CAUTION ADVISED AT CLARK'S BRIDGE

At the beginning of this school year, the Public Works Department urges you to be careful when crossing Clark's bridge with your vehicle, since this traffic sign is not always known by all drivers taking this road. We would like to remind you that the new traffic sign indicates that you should:

«YIELD THE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO ONCOMING TRAFFIC»

Which means that traffic going South (towards Quebec City) does not have to stop while traffic going North (towards Redmond Road) is obliged to yield the way to oncoming traffic.

Zoning By-law # 148 - 8.2 WINTER SHELTERS, SNOW FENCES AND WINTER PROTECTION

Winter shelters for both vehicles and pedestrians located at the entrance of a building, and snow fences and other winter protection are allowed in all areas, from <u>October</u> <u>Ist</u> to April 30th of the following year.

Location

- a) A winter shelter cannot be built on a vacant lot.
- b) The winter shelter can be erected in the front yard as a parking space on the driveway or vehicular or pedestrian access to this area. The winter shelter can be located in the side or rear yard.
- c) A winter shelter cannot be installed closer than 3 meters (9.8 feet) from the paving, and must be on one's private property.
- d) A winter shelter cannot be installed at less than 3 meters (9.8 feet) of a fire hydrant, or be attached to it.

Structure

a) The structure of a winter shelter can be made of wood

or metal. Structure or framework must not be apparent.

b) Winter shelters must be evenly covered with canvas specifically designed for this purpose (eg: Fabrene) or painted or stained wood panels; The use of polythene is prohibited. One single type of covering material is allowed per winter shelter.

Special Provisions

- a) An additional annex building (carport, gallery, porch, etc.) can be closed during the same period and with the approved materials aforementioned.
- b) The winter shelters including a structure and snow fences must be dismantled and removed at the end of the period allowed for each year and be stored in an area invisible from the street.
- c) A winter shelter must be kept clean, firmly anchored and well maintained (no canvas or damaged canvas, unattached, etc.).

HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE DEPOT (HHW) SEPTEMBER 21ST

The Municipality will offer a hazardous household waste recycling depot, free of charge, on Sunday, SEPTEMBER 21st from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier). You must bring your dangerous materials to the depot location.

Here is a list of materials that can be recuperated:

PAINTS

Paints:

- sold by retail businesses (100 ml containers and larger)
- sold by wholesale businesses (170 L containers and larger intended for architectural use)
- primers and paints (latex, alkyd, enamel and
- metal or anti-rust paint
- aluminum paint
- dyes
- varnishes
- lacquers
- products or preparations for the treatment of wood (preservatives) or masonry (acrylic sealers for driveways)
- signalisation paints (those available in retail businesses)

Aerosol paints

ORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acetone, adhesives, aerosols, solid fire starter, alcohol, starter fluid, glue, wax, antifreeze, caulking, dye, plastic cement, solid fuel, fondue fuel, lock de-icer, degreasing agents, oil stain remover, paint thinner, petroleum distillate, ink, epoxy, gasoline, ethylene glycol, roofing tar, motor grease, heating and lamp oil, lubricant, methanol, petroleum, polish, Polyfilla, leather, suede or vinyl protector, liquid resin, silicone sealant, wallpaper remover, shoe dye, turpentine, toluene.

INORGANIC HAZARDOUS WASTE

Acids, bases, oxidizing agents, batteries, pesticides and insecticides

Fluorescent compact light bulbs (CFL)



If you are not sure that a product you would like to dispose of is on the list, bring it in to the depot and the trained employees will help you.

Each container must be intended for residential use only.

All products must be in their original containers. For safety reasons, do not mix products.

During this collection, you may also take in your used oil, used oil filters and oil containers (non commercial use only). This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only. Thank you for your active participation for a clean and healthy environment!


DISTRIBUTION OF WOOD CHIPS

You may reserve equipment to clean your chimney at the Municipality. This service is free of charge.





BULK WASTE PICKUP (DRY MATERIALS)

The weekly collection of non-household waste (dry materials) is held every Tuesday until November 18. The last week of November, the collection will take place on **Thursday**, November 27. Starting the first week of December and this, for the winter season (December, January and February), the collection will take place the first Thursday of each month.

This service functions on a call-in basis only. Please do not deposit non-household waste in front of containers or community mailboxes. You must call the Municipality at 418 844-1218 to request this service and give us an itemized list of materials to be picked up. You may also register for the collection on the Municipality's website (www.saint-gabriel-de-valcartier.ca) on the home page in the section "Online Request".

It is important that these materials be sorted and set out in an organized manner (ex: carpets rolled and tied, metal sorted, wire rolled and tied, etc.).

You may dispose of used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. However, the tires must be separated from the rims.

Please note that vehicle carcasses or frames, tree and brush debris, household garbage and leaves as well as recyclable materials will not be collected during these weekly pick ups.

You may not dispose of renovation materials in your regular garbage bin as the waste management company will not pick up your garbage. We can pick up a limited amount of these materials in the non-household waste weekly pick up. You must first place a request with Dany Laberge, person responsible for Public Works. For major renovations, contact the Municipality to find out where you can dispose of these materials.

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR FALLEN LEAVES

Bags of leaves will not be picked up during the regular weekly collection of household garbage.

The Municipality will organize a special collection on Tuesday,

November 4th, 2014. Bags of leaves should be placed by the side of the road in front of your residence. No reservation required.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING CONTAINERS

We would like to remind residents that large garbage and recycling containers located on a number of nonmunicipalized streets are there for the use of residents who do not have door to door collection for garbage and recycling. Because they do not have rolling bins, the Municipality has installed large garbage and recycling bins for their use only. When residents who benefit from door to door collection use these containers. those with the right to use them cannot dispose of their waste since the containers are full.

Please be civil and respectful towards your fellow citizens and do not use these containers if they are not meant for you.

Notice to Sommet Bleu Development and Domaine William Neilson residents

To avoid the nuisance of wild animals getting into your garbage, all household waste



must be deposited inside and not next to the containers put at your disposal.

Please note that the garbage removal company will not pick up garbage which has been left next to the containers. If containers are full, we ask that you please wait until next collection day.

As for the recycling, you must fold or cut cardboard boxes before depositing them in the recycling bins in order to avoid filling these up too quickly.

To dispose of dry materials, please contact the municipal office.

The ÉcoRénov tax credit is designed for individuals who have ecoresponsible renovation work carried out by a qualified contractor on their primary residence or cottage under an agreement entered into after October 7, 2013 and before November 1, 2014.

In order to benefit from this tax credit, works carried out must have a positive impact on the energy consumption or environmental level and the materials used in the course of this work must meet recognized standards. Note that this program also applies to work that may include septic installations.

BREAKING AND ENTERING

As defined under the Criminal Code, a B&E occurs when an individual enters someone's home or other property illegally, with the intent to commit a crime.

The individual is not required to have entered the premises by breaking a security device.

The offender is not required to have actually committed a theft to be accused of breaking and entering.

B&E is the most frequently-committed property crime in Quebec, after theft of \$5,000 or less. Thus, in 2010 in Quebec, 53,219 B&E incidents were reported to police services, while 95,857 thefts of less than \$5,000 were committed, out of a total of 370,052 offences under the Criminal Code (not including crimes related to driving a vehicle).

B&E offences occur most often in:

- Private residences (from July to December)
- Cottages (from May to November)

They mostly take place during the day (between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.), Mondays to Fridays.

Preventing home theft

In Québec, a house or an apartment is visited by burglars every four minutes and, in the majority of cases, two or three minutes are all they need to get inside.

However, you can greatly reduce your risk and discourage thieves with a few simple but efficient precautions.

- Buy safe and sturdy locks for your doors and lock them.
- Before leaving your home, lock all windows and don't forget the windows in the basement.
- Try to ensure, as much as possible, that all doors and windows are kept cleared of all objects (fence, shrub, etc.) which would help a thief to hide.
- Avoid keeping large sums of money in the house and store jewellery and valuables in unusual places.
- Protect your sliding doors and windows by installing a security bar or piece of wood in the lower track.
- Install fixed wire mesh with one-way screws to protect basement windows.
- Install a peep hole on your door rather than a chain lock; this will allow you to verify the identity of the person knocking at your door.

Prevent when you're away!

When you're away, it is very important that your **home** looks occupied. Here are a few tips to discourage **burglars.**

Short term absence

• Lock all doors and windows and activate your security system.

- Leave the radio turned on.
- Leave some lights on and use a timer.
- Don't leave a note on the door saying that you're away.

Long term absence

- Depending on the season, clear the snow from walkways or mow the lawn and ask a friend or neighbour to continue this maintenance during your absence.
- Advise a friend or neighbour of your departure and ask this
 person to pick up the mail and newspapers or ask the post
 office to keep your mail and temporarily suspend
 newspaper deliveries.
- Invite a neighbour to park his car in your driveway. Give him your return date and a way to reach you in case of emergencies.
- Follow the tips for a short absence.
- The information you share on social media is also a
 precious source of information for thieves. During your
 absence, avoid sharing information that could compromise
 the security of your home (departure and return dates for
 a trip, address and place of residence, etc.).

Know how to fool thieves

While it is very pleasant to go on vacation, coming home to discover that burglars have taken everything can quickly neutralize the beneficial effect of your vacation.

Entrust a neighbour with your keys and ask him to:

- Turn lamps on or off
- Turn the radio on and off and open and close window coverings
- Water plants, shovel the entryway or mow the lawn
- Move your car or park his in your driveway.

Also, make sure...

- To interrupt any mail or newspaper deliveries or ask a neighbour to pick it up.
- Inspect the grounds and surroundings the day before your departure and put away any garden tools in the shed and lock it's door.
- Ask a neighbour to regularly inspect the outside and inside of your home.

A good **security system** and an outside light equipped with a motion detector or timer helps to discourage thieves.

NEW - FIRE SAFETY SERVICES

On June 4th the Fire Safety Services of Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier received delivery of their new 1500 gallon pumpertanker.

This purchase represents an investment of 276 000 \$ for the Municipality and replaces the 1979 Chevrolet C70 pumpertanker. Like the old truck, our volunteer fire department is celebrating 35 years of dedicated service.

The new vehicle is equipped with a foam injection system FoamPro and has a I 500 gallon reservoir. The truck can also transport up to 5 firefighters and their

equipment, including breathing apparatuses, and will contribute to maximizing the efficiency of our emergency response.

The new pumper-tanker will help improve public safety while

meeting precise needs of the fire department with regards to water supply required by the governments Risk Management Plan.

As well as serving the residents of Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier, Fire Safety Services, within the scope of a mutual aide agreement, participates in major incidents when needed by other fire departments within the MRC de la Jacques-Cartier.

The Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services is entirely made up of volunteers with 28 firefighters and 13 first responders.

FIRE PREVENTION HOME VISITS

Residential fire prevention visits are being carried out by uniformed firefighters from the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services. Their goal is to inspect the installation, function and conformity of smoke detectors on each floor of your residence. Visits will take place from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. from May to November. Each residence is visited every six (6) years.

A SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR HALLOWEEN

Boulevard Valcartier, between Morley Street and the Dépanneur du Village; Morley Street; Domaine St-Gabriel; Place Leduc.

We ask drivers to please be vigilant along the streets mentioned above and to travel below the posted speed limit. We also ask the collaboration of the people residing along the patrolled route to please keep their dogs tied and to turn off their outside lights if they are

unable to participate or when they can no longer receive trick-or-treaters. Thank you very much for your cooperation and we hope that this effort will help the children enjoy a safe and happy Halloween.

Donnacona dam failure: What will happen to the salmon?

Following the recent occurrence involving the Donnacona dam on the night of May 17th, 2014, the *Corporation du bassin de La Jacques-Cartier* (CBJC) found it important to take stock of the status of the salmon in the Jacques-Cartier River.

A bit of history

Atlantic salmon, it seems, has always been abundant in the Jacques-Cartier River. Unfortunately, intensive and commercial fishing has not helped its fate. In addition, the construction of the dam at the mouth of the river in 1913 prevented Atlantic salmon to travel up the river. Finally, several decades of floating timber have contributed to change the configuration of the river, destroy spawning grounds downstream Gorges Déry and deteriorate the Gorges, making them more difficult to cross. All these factors have led to the disappearance of Atlantic salmon in the Jacques-Cartier River.

It was in the 1970s when came the idea to reintroduce Atlantic salmon in the river and led to the creation of the Corporation to restore the Jacques-Cartier in 1979. In 1985, a fish pass was built in Donnacona to allow them to cross the dam during the upstream migration. Their capture at the top of the fish pass in a cage specially designed for this purpose, allowed the CBJC to transport salmon to other spawning sites. It was in 1998 that the fish pass was moved to CapSanté using the same principle.

Salmon is a major element in the history of the Jacques-Cartier River and an excellent example of civic engagement. Atlantic salmon reintroduction efforts in the Jacques-Cartier River have been underway for 33 years. This tremendous work has been accomplished by thousands of volunteer hours from those involved, as well as the investment of municipal and provincial sectors.

The consequences

Dam failure has brought about significant changes in the configuration of the river. Thus, there is no more pit allowing salmon to borrow the migratory pass, which is now out of the water. Salmon can no longer be caught in the cage from the fish pass.

This allows the salmon to travel up the river by themselves. Good news you say? Not quite. The salmon will meet an impassable natural barrier recognized since the early 1900s: the Déry Gorges. It is therefore necessary to find a solution to capture salmon and transport them to the breeding sites in the Jacques-Cartier National Park. This is the only way reintroduction efforts may be pursued.

The CBJC is currently, a partner in the initiatives designed to capture salmon during the 2014 upstream migration so that they may be saved and safeguard the salmon resource. A fine



example of concerted effort among community stakeholders!

Closure of the fish pass

Due to these exceptional circumstances, there will be no interpretive activities at the Cap-Santé migratory pass during the summer of 2014. Therefore, the site will be closed for an indefinite period.

Migration of the salmon in the Jacques-Cartier and salmon fishing

Following the Donnacona dam failure, a new capture cage was installed to ensure the continuity of salmon transportation.

Transport is of great importance to the survival of the species in the river and is an effective reintroduction effort. Salmon can not ascend the Jacques-Cartier River by themselves to reach breeding sites due to the presence of the Déry Gorges, an almost impenetrable natural barrier.

Some worry about the late migratory season this year. We must not forget that Atlantic salmon are migratory and that several other factors threaten them outside the Jacques-Cartier River. Thus, commercial fishing and a late spring season could explain the delay of the run, and this, in the majority of Quebec's rivers.

We would like remind you that fishing for Atlantic salmon is prohibited everywhere on the Jacques-Cartier River. Accidental catches must be returned to the water under penalty of heavy fines. Remember that Article 20 of the Federal Fisheries Act "prohibits fishing within less than twenty-three meters downstream from the lowest entrance of any fish pass or any obstacle or leap area." This applies to the gate installed under the bridges between Donnacona and Cap-Santé. Moreover, these places are under camera surveillance.
