We would like to extend our thanks to the residents, the volunteers and employees for their cooperation and hard-work. Our emergency measures have been put to the test and we are very pleased with how the crisis was handled. Such events are very unfortunate but we are very blessed with a community such as ours who comes together in times of need.

Regarding projects for the

coming year, there are many plans in the works. Our major road works project this summer will be on Redmond Road on a distance of 1.2 km taking us to the des Plateaux intersection. Engineers are working on preparing the project and works will begin in the coming months. If you recall we will be extending the fire hall garage to make room for a new fire truck. We had to change our septic installations to accommodate this project and are awaiting the certificate of authorization from the Environment to start. The new fire truck should be delivered in June.

The municipal council held a planning committee to do a feasibility study for future municipal infrastructures. This brain-storming session was an interesting one with many ideas being discussed which led to some concrete actions. Engineers have been asked to determine if it is possible to use the space under the present Community Center hall. Urban planning experts have also been tasked with providing a report detailing the best use of the land composing our municipal facilities. We are looking forward to the results of these studies.

The week of April 6-12 was officially acclaimed as volunteer week. We can never thank our volunteers enough for all they do. Our Municipality would not be the same without your stellar work. Thank you once again!

MESSAGE FROM THE SQ for road safety

SAFE SHARING OF THE ROAD

In the coming weeks, people travelling by bike, foot, skateboard or any other means will be more and more present on the roads given the milder spring weather.

Car and motorcycle drivers must therefore respect road signs and remain particularly vigilant when approaching intersections, in residential sectors and on roads often used by bicycles.

Respect of road and traffic signs for all road users is essential to reduce collision risks which might cause death or injury. Whether they be a motorist, biker, cyclist or pedestrian, citizens must avoid all distractions and pay attention to traffic signs when driving on public roads.

For motorists:

- Respect speed limits;
- Stop you vehicle before the stop line;
- Yield passage to pedestrians;
- Check your blind spot before performing a maneuver;
- Turn on headlights to be well visible at all times.

For pedestrians:

- Always walk on the sidewalk;
- If there is no sidewalk, walk on the roadside or beside the pavement facing oncoming traffic:
- Use areas provided for crossing the
- Establish visual contact with drivers before crossing.

Remember that pedestrians are among the most vulnerable road users. In 2013, there were 24 pedestrians who lost their lives in a road collision, that is 10 more than in 2012.

MAY 25th HHW RECYCLING DEPOT

The Municipality will offer a hazardous household waste (HHW) recycling depot, free of charge, on <u>Sunday, May 25th from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.</u> at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier).

You must bring your dangerous materials to the depot location.

Here is a list of materials that can be recuperated:

PAINTS

Paints:

- sold by retail businesses (100 ml containers and larger)
- sold by wholesale businesses (170 L containers and larger intended for architectural use)
- primers and paints (latex, alkyd, enamel and other)
- metal or anti-rust paint
- aluminum paint
- dyes
- varnishes
- lacquers
- products or preparations for the treatment of wood (preservatives) or masonry (acrylic sealers for driveways)
- signalisation paints (those available in retail businesses)

Aerosol paints

ORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE


Acetone, adhesives, aerosols, solid fire starter, rubbing alcohol, starter fluid, glue, wax, antifreeze, caulking, dye, plastic cement, solid fuel, fondue fuel, lock de-icer, degreasing agents, oil stain remover, paint thinner, petroleum distillate, ink, epoxy, gasoline, ethylene glycol, roofing tar, motor grease, heating and lamp oil, lubricant, methanol, petroleum, polish, Polyfilla, leather, suede or vinyl protector, liquid resin, silicone sealant, wallpaper remover, shoe dye, turpentine, toluene.

INORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acids, bases, oxidizing agents, batteries, pesticides and insecticides
Fluorescent compact light

bulbs (CFL)





If you are not sure if a product that you would like to dispose of is on the list, bring it in to the depot and the trained employees will help you.

Each container must be intended for residential use only.

All products must be in their original containers.

For safety reasons, do not mix products.

During this collection, you may also bring in your used oil, used oil filters and oil containers (**non commercial use only**).

This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only.

MAY IS NATIONAL FOREST MONTH

In collaboration with the Association forestière des deux rives (AF2R), the Municipality will give you a sapling when you bring in your hazardous household waste on Sunday, May 25th.

On Sunday, May 25th, 2014 will be held the 5th edition of the Family festival A Tree for Me at the at the Chutes-de-la-Chaudière park in Charny (Lévis). This activity is organized by the Association forestière des deux rives (AF2R), in collaboration with the Direction régionale de la Capitale-Nationale et de la Chaudière-Appalaches of the Ministry of Natural Resources (MRN) and the City of Lévis.

This event falls within the framework of May, National Forest Month.

From 10 a.m. to p.m., nature lovers and their families are entitled to all kinds of exciting and rewarding activities and more, including the exhibitors under the big top. Clowns, balloon sculptors and face painting artists will also be present to entertain the little ones!

This family festival is the opportunity to hand out free tree saplings to parents enrolled in the programme Ministry of National Resources A Tree for Me



program and to the general public. Over 2000 trees were distributed in 2013.

BIOLOGICAL CONTROL OF MOSQUITOES AND BLACK FLIP

The Municipality has awarded the contract for the biological control of mosquitoes and black flies for summer 2014 to the firm GDG Environnement ltée www.gdg.ca. Treatments begin in early spring and will be carried out on several occasions until the end of August by GDG professionals.

GDG team members will tour the Municipality and its surrounding areas on several occasions during the summer season in order to proceed with the treatments.

In this context, we call for the collaboration of all citizens in order to permit access to all mosquito-breeding sites.

These treatments are expected to yield results to reduce the number of pests and insects by 80% or more until September 1st.

GDG's team of professionals will be residing in the Municipality for the duration of the contract, that is, from mid-April until the end of August. The coordinator is Mr. Eric Cliche.

SOME PRACTICAL ADVICE:

To eliminate the artificial breeding areas where biting insects proliferate, the following measures should be taken:

- Start the swimming pool as early as possible – it could produce mosquitoes by the third week of May;
- Keep drain pipes in good repair and

cleaned of accumulated debris that prevents the evacuation of rainwater;

- Dispose of old tires and store others in a dry place;
- Overturn small boats or remove the drain on those left upright;
- Remove water accumulated in tarpaulins;
- Wheelbarrows, rain barrels, birdbaths, buckets and containers of all sorts constitute excellent breeding sites for mosquitoes.

Remember that swarms of mosquitoes can be produced every seven to eight days in water that has been left to accumulate.

The Municipality is looking for volunteers to conduct "nuisance tests" for the biological control of mosquitoes and black flies

The effectiveness of the control program is measured by "nuisance tests" which are performed by the staff of GDG Environnement in the presence of an independent witness. Tests will be done three times a week on the territory. We are in need of witnesses. If you are interested in participating, please let us know by calling 418 844-1218.

Duration of the testing process is approximately 15 to 30 minutes.

A SAFE POOL, A PERFECT SWIM


The Quebec Government as well as many municipalities have adopted by-laws to insure the safety of private residential swimming pools. Their application aims to reduce the risk of drowning, particularly of children under the age of 5, by controlling and protecting access to residential pools.

The by-law concerns:

- In-ground pools
- Semi in-ground pools
- Above-ground pools
- Temporary pools (soft sided, inflatable or not)
- Spas with a capacity higher than 2000 litres

All other residential

exterior artificial basins, temporary or permanent intended for bathing purposes deeper than 60 cm.



If necessary, the Municipality is available for voluntary inspections. An inspection is required with the issuing of a permit upon completion of the work.

REMINDER -WINTER SHELTERS

Winter shelters are considered temporary in light of their construction (mobile wood panels or canvas) and must be dismantled after their period of use in accordance with the established by-law. Winter garages and snow fences are authorized in all zones, from October 1st to April 30th.

Please respect your neighborhood and comply to this regulation under penalty of law.



(\$200 minimum per day for a continuing offense).

IMPORTANCE OF THE MUNICPAL PERMIT

The Municipality's Urbanism Department would like to remind citizens of the importance of applying for a permit with the inspector before beginning any construction work. Whether for a new construction, to undergo renovations or carry out repairs to an existing building, this requirement remains the same. Actually, by neglecting to request this information from the Municipality, works undertaken could turn out to be non-compliant and sooner or later, could translate into problems which could be difficult to manage. During the sale or succession of an immovable where non compliant works have been carried out, past negligence could come back to haunt the proprietor. You must know that, generally, if no permit has been issued for works, the Municipality can do absolutely nothing to correct these often inconvenient situations.

To summarize, when you have a project in mind and want to avoid problems, even before going to meet the notary, architect, surveyor or financial institution, schedule an appointment with the Urbanism Department of the Municipality in order to gather all the required information

SPECIAL LEAF PICK UP

Bags of leaves <u>are</u> not accepted during the weekly pickup of household garbage.

The Municipality will hold a special collection <u>the week of May 12th, 2014</u>. Bags of leaves should be placed by the side of the road in front of your residence.

CIVIC NUMBERS

Your civic number must be clearly visible!

In order to facilitate the work of Fire Safety Services, emergency crews and the police on our territory as well as any emergency teams liable to be called to your residence in an emergency situation, it is important that you post your civic number clearly and in full view on your home as well as on your mailbox (if applicable), according to municipal Bylaws. Ref. Installation and visibility of civic numbers, Bylaw no. 150, article 3.8.

The Urbanism Department will be performing inspections this spring and correction notices will be given for violations.

GARAGE OR YARD SALE REGULATIONS

Here is some information regarding garage sales:

A garage sale is a temporary activity. It is the sale of personal items and non-commercial furniture surplus, used or acquired for domestic use by the occupants of the property whereby these items are displayed or put up for sale and the number or the quantity of these items do not exceed the normal needs of the occupants.

A garage sale is permitted in all zones but it must be complementary or accessory to the residential use of the same property. Garage sales are not permitted on vacant lots.

A garage sale is temporary. It is allowed only twice per year for a maximum of 2

consecutive days for each sale.

The following conditions must be met in order to hold a garage sale on a lot where a residential building is located:

- a) the objects for sale must belong to the occupants of the dwelling where the garage sale is being held.;
- b) the permitted time period to hold a garage is sale is from May 15th to October 15th of each year;
- c) the sale tables may not impede traffic on the property, sidewalk or road;
- d) the sale tables may be located in the front yard and on the public right of way however respecting a minimal

- distance of 2 meters (6.6 feet) from the pavement.;
- e) the sale tables may be located in the side and back yards at a minimal distance of 2 meters (6.6 feet) from the back and side lines of the property;
- f) the sale tables and other installations (shelves, tables, racks, etc) necessary for the garage sale must be in good repair and maintained as such, and must be removed at the end of the maximum permitted time period.
- g) all signs or posters outside of the property are prohibited.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES AS A DOG OWNER

Dogs are "Man's best friend". They are intelligent animals and enjoyed by many. Unfortunately, at times they may be a nuisance to others. The Municipality would like to remind you that as an owner of one or more dogs, you are fully responsible for respecting the municipal by-law concerning the right to keep an animal on your property. By-law number 158 is available for consultation upon request. Here are some excerpts of this regulation:

• As proprietor or keeper of an animal, you must not let your pet roam freely in a public area (park, street) or onto private property, other than your own, without the consent of the property owner or occupant. NOTE: As the Municipality is proprietor of all public streets/parks/public areas, it is forbidden to let your animal roam freely in these

areas.

- All dogs must be registered with the Municipality. The license or dog tag is valid from January 1st to December 31st and must be renewed annually.
- A maximum of three (3) dogs is permitted per dwelling unit.
- A dog which is kept outside of a building must be retained by a device (such as a leash, enclosed fence, etc.) preventing the animal from leaving the owner's property.
- A dog owner must keep their animal on a leash at all times if circulating in a public area (including a street). This leash must be no longer than two (2) meters.
- Nuisance: The following constitutes a nuisance if you are the keeper or owner of
 - 1. A dog that has already bitten an animal or a human being.
 - 2. A dog of the following breeds: bull-terrier, staffordshire bull-terrier, american bull-terrier, american staffordshire terrier, or a crossbreed from one of the previously mentioned breeds commonly called « pit-bull ».
 - 3. An animal not indigenous to the Quebec territory.
- In the case of violation to the by-law, the minimum fine is \$100 plus costs, up to a maximum of \$1,000 plus costs.
- For the territory of the Municipality, the application of by-laws and fines are entrusted to the municipal inspector and the Sureté du Québec police force, with the support of the "Société protectrice des animaux" (Society for the Protection of Animals).

We wish to remind you that in the case of a nuisance, it is highly recommended initially to attempt to discuss the problem with the dog owner. Often, friendly dialogue and respect between neighbours are the most effective ways to solve a problem or inconvenience. Thank you for your cooperation!

CANINE EDUCATION COURSES

We would like for your dog to be welcome where ever you go so that you may have many harmonious years together. We will call on its intelligence and we will take all the time needed for each lesson with compassion.

Also, when you participate in our group courses, we remain available to respond to your questions, even after the course is finished, at no extra cost, by phone or by email.

Depending on the weather, the courses will take place: at the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier skating rink or at the Auberge des 4 Pattes in Wendake.

BULK PICK UP

The weekly collection of non-household waste (bulk waste) is held on a weekly basis every Tuesday. This service functions on a call-in basis only, please do not deposit non-household waste in front of large refuse containers or community mailboxes. You must call the Municipality at 418 844-1218 to schedule this service and give us an itemized list of materials to be collected. It is important that the materials to be collected by the Municipality be set out in an organized manner (ex: carpets must be rolled and tied, metal must be sorted, wire must be rolled and tied, etc.)

Objects that qualify for bulk pick up:

*Used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. However, the tires must be separated from the rims. *Vegetable oils used for cooking in their original containers or in a clear well identified plastic container.

Objects that DO NOT qualify for bulk pick up:

- *Vehicle carcasses or frames *Tree and brush debris
- *Household garbage *Leaves and *Recyclable materials.

For renovation materials, you may not dispose of these in your black garbage bin as the waste management company will not pick up your garbage. We can collect a limited amount of these materials in the non-household waste weekly pick up. You must first make a request to Dany Laberge, Person responsible for Public Works. Thank you for your collaboration.

WATER MAIN ENTRY VALVE

Each residence serviced by the aqueduct network is equipped with a water main entry valve which connects to the



water supply. The water main entry valve to the aqueduct network which sticks out of the ground at the front of your property, commonly called "bottle" is buried underground, generally in front of the residence, usually at the the limit of the property between the municipal and the owner's properties. It is therefore very important that this entry valve be visible and accessible at all times. None other than a municipal employee is authorized to handle this water hook up.

GARBAGE CONTAINERS

NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS OF THE MUNICIPALITY

The containers located at the bottom of Joseph-Moraldo Street are reserved exclusively for the use of those residing in the Sommet Bleu sector. These containers are strictly reserved for garbage and recycling services



in this sector. The Municipality offers a weekly non-household waste collection (bulk pick up) on Tuesdays. Therefore, please reserve your pick up as needed for this type of waste

By the same occasion, the Public Works Department would like to remind all citizens that the containers located close to the municipal garage are strictly reserved for the use of the Municipality and not for the general public.

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

COLLECTIVE TREATMENT TO ERADICATE AMBROSIA (RAGWEED)

The Municipality will again participate in 2014 in a treatment program to eradicate ragweed.

The common goal is to permanently eliminate this highly allergenic plant.



We count on the participation of the entire community in order to reach our goal to permanently eliminate ragweed.

Here's how you can actively participate:

- 1. Uproot any ragweed plants on your property.
- 2. Locate the infested zones in your neighbourhood.
- 3. Make your neighbours aware of the hazards posed by this plant.

This annual collective program aims to reduce pollen levels and this, in the best interest of the local population.

The socioeconomic impact related to respiratory allergies amounts to 250 million dollars annually.







INFO-STOP PROGRAM FOR SENIORS

The Info-Stop Program is designed for seniors and retired people as well as those with reduced autonomy living at home or in a residence.

Established for the first time in Montérégie in 1993, it was updated and is now used in Sainte-Catherine-de-la-Jacques-Cartier, the first municipality of the MRC and in Quebec to put it to work!

A PROGRAM WITH TWO USES

The program is divided into two tools: The first consists of a vinyl magnetic sign to put on the refrigerator. It serves as a reference offering a list of useful telephone numbers for seniors. The second tool is a capsule that one would put in the fridge that contains important information such as identity, health information and people to contact in case of emergency. In the case of a distress call from the user, by seeing the Info-Stop sign, first responders will know right away that a capsule is inside the fridge and thus be able to act promptly. A simple but practical tool, according to the director of the SQ office for the MRC de la Jacques-Cartier, Lt. Simon Guay.
