Public Works and Urbanism

In order to avoid any inconvenience during the winter season, the Municipality would like to remind you of a few regulations that may help the snow removal process.

By-Law No. 120

Article 8.1:

Parking of vehicles on public roads

We would like to remind you that:

"Except in cases of major breakdowns, no one may park, abandon, or immobilize a motor vehicle in such a way that it may hide signage, impede traffic, road maintenance or snow removal or block access to a street or property." (Under penalty of law)

Article 11.1:

Nuisance

In addition to a penalty of law (fine) the police may order the removal of any vehicle parked in such a way that it may impede traffic, road works, including road maintenances or snow removal; and may therefore order the towing of this vehicle.

Article 12:

Fine

All infractions to the present by-law renders the offender liable to pay a minimum fine of \$30.00 plus costs.

By-Law No 119

Article 8.1.4:

Conditions concerning snow and ice:

It is prohibited for any person to throw or dispose of snow or ice onto the traffic lanes of all roads or the sides of said roads under penalty of law.



There are unfortunately a minority of off-road enthusiasts who tarnish the public image of the sport by riding where they shouldn't.

- Be as quiet as possible with your off-road vehicle,
- especially when driving close to houses;
- You cannot ride on a public road except in rare

A New Face at the Teen Club

The Teen Club is presently in a transitional period following my nomination as the new coordinator last October and changes will be made in the coming months. I am very pleased to be a part of this wonderful team and to meet the teens of the Community. I have been living in the region since September in order to continue my master's degree in orientation science at Laval University but I am a Côte-Nord native. Since I just completed my diploma in psycho education last April, I find that this job will be very rewarding. Moreover, after working here for a couple of weeks I've noticed that the teens have a strong feeling of belonging to the Teen Club and that the Teen Club is a place where teens can gather to chat with each other, but also a place where they can seek comfort and advice from the animators. There are also many activities offered each month such as cooking workshops, outings to the movies, outdoor outings and thematic activities according to the seasons. The monthly calendar of activities is available on the municipal web site under the "Services" tab. Starting in December, you may also view our activities on the community TV channel (12) through vignettes that will allow you to discover the Teen Club.

The involvement of teens is essential for us which is why we want them to give their opinions on the choice of activities and on different decisions regarding the Teen Following certain Club. requests, we recently decided that the Teen Club should get a makeover and the colors will be changed to better represent our teens. Also, new divisions will be made so that all teens will be able to practice different activities. Consequently, if you have furniture in good condition that you would like to get rid of, it will be a pleasure for us to pick up donated furniture and give it a second life.

The Teen Club is open Thursdays from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m., Fridays from 6:30 to 10:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 2:00 to 10:00 p.m. Teens who wish to come to the Teen Club must be between 11 and 17 years old. The services are offered free

of charge with the exception of special outings. A canteen is also available in the Club. Teen Club is open for children 6 to 11 years old on the first Friday of every month. Payment by check: Payments by check must be made in one payment dated January 15^{th} , 2009 and in the name of "Municipalité de Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier".
