## Septic Waste Collection for Residential Dwellings

In 2007, the Municipality of Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier put in place a project to guarantee the emptying of septic installations on a regular basis in order to prevent soil and water pollution. The septic tank of a permanent residence will be emptied every two years and the septic tank of a seasonal residence will be emptied at least once every 4 years. This year, all septic tanks with a capacity equal to or inferior to 4.8 m<sup>3</sup> (1056 gallons) and located in areas accessible by the vehicle providing this service will be emptied.

Following the 2007 collection, we took note of a few problems which proprietors must fix. Among others, if one of the tank covers is damaged, we suggest that you take the necessary steps to fix or replace it in order to avoid eventual problems with your septic installation or leaching bed (drain field). Notably, if residues (soil, sand, dead leaves, etc.) infiltrate your installation, this could cause long term problems such as clogging the purification system. At that time, a new leaching bed might have to be installed. Therefore, we strongly recommend that you have the situation fixed before the next collection. Also, both tank covers must be cleared of obstructions. We've decided to do a complete waste collection (both covers) of septic tanks in order to prevent eventual problems, notably, to insure that your leaching bed is in good working order. By doing a complete waste collection, we can rapidly confirm, by visual examination, if the leaching bed evacuates liquids as it should. Should you require practical advice on how to leave your covers permanently unobstructed and accessible, you can contact the Assistant Municipal Inspector during business hours, Monday to Friday from 8:30 am to 12:00 pm and from 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm. For residences or chalets equipped with a cesspool, please note that the Assistant Municipal Inspector will contact you in order to discuss available options to replace your cesspool. All residences must be equipped with a sewage system compliant with provincial regulation, except in the case of residences built before August 12, 1981 if wastewater does not constitute a source of pollution. Even in this last case, the Municipality strongly recommends that regulation standards be respected.

Septic waste collection will begin on June 1<sup>st</sup> and will be carried out until August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2009 from Monday to Friday between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

and, when necessary, on Saturdays until 12:00 noon. If, upon the first visit, the septic tank cover is not cleared or cannot easily be located thus preventing the collection of septic waste, a fee of \$65.00 can be charged to the proprietor if a second visit is required.

This service is financed by the general land tax. The Municipality will advise proprietors by mail of the septic waste collection schedule for their sector at least 10 days prior to the service. New residences built as of January 2009 will not receive this service this year since the septic installation will not have be used for a period over 6 months.

Any additional septic waste collection, outside of the scheduled collection, will be done by the contractor hired by the Municipality at the expense of the proprietor. Please call the municipal office for further details about the company to contact for this service.

For proprietors or occupants who do not expect to be present when the service is scheduled please clearly indicate where your system is located. Any animals must be kept away.

#### For the emptying of your septic tank, you must ensure that:

- Access to your septic tank is cleared of obstructions by a width of 3.96 meters (13 feet) and height of 3.96 meters (13 feet), if your tank is situated more than 60 meters (200 feet) from your driveway or the road.
- Septic tank covers and their perimeters must be cleared by approx. 20 cm (8 inches) to permit their removal without causing damage.

## Hazardous Household Waste Recycling Depot (HHW)

The Municipality will offer a hazardous household waste recycling depot, free of charge, on **Sunday, May 24**th from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier).

You must bring your dangerous materials to the depot location.

Here is the list of materials that will be recycled on that day:

#### **PAINTS**







- sold by retail businesses (100 ml containers and larger)
- sold by wholesale businesses (170 L containers and larger intended for architectural use)
- primers and paints (latex, alkyd, enamel and other)
- metal or anti-rust paint
- aluminium paint
- dyes
- varnishes
- lacquers
- products or preparations for the treatment of wood (preservatives) or masonry (acrylic sealers for driveways)
- signalisation paints (those available in retail businesses)

Aerosol paints

#### ORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WAS TE

Acetone, adhesives, aerosols, solid fire starter, rubbing alcohol, starter fluid, glue, wax, antifreeze, caulking, dye, plastic cement, solid fuel, fondue fuel, lock de-icer, degreasing agents, oil stain remover, paint thinner, petroleum distillate, ink, epoxy, gasoline, ethylene glycol, roofing tar, motor grease, heating and lamp oil, lubricant, methanol, petroleum, polish, Polyfilla, leather, suede or vinyl protector, liquid resin, silicone sealant, wallpaper remover, shoe dye, turpentine, toluene.

#### INORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acids, bases, oxidizing agents, batteries, pesticides and insecticides

Fluorescent compact lightbulbs (CFL)



If you are not sure if a product that you would like to dispose of is on the list, bring it in to the depot and the trained employees will help you.

Each container must be intended for residential use only. All products must be in their original containers.

For safety reasons, do not mix products.

During this collection, you may also take in your used oil, used oil filters and oil containers (non commercial use only). This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only.

The next hazardous household waste recycling depot will be held on Sunday, September 13th, 2009. Thank you for your active participation for a healthy environment!

## Already 66 424 appliances collected!

9 MONTHS AFTER IT'S LAUNCH, THE RECYC-FRIGO ENVIRONNEMENT<sup>MD</sup> PROGRAM PROVES TO BE A HUGE SUCCESS WITH CITIZENS:

**May 2009** – The RECYC-FRIGO program has been a great success from its inception in April of last year and the Municipality is proud to report that citizens continue to manifest their interest in this program. As of December 31st, 2008, nine months after it's launch, 66 424 appliances have been recuperated throughout the province of Quebec, that is to say 29% of the global objective anticipated by the end of the program in 2010. This is thanks to you!

RECYC-FRIGO offers a free service to pick up your old appliance under the condition that the refrigerator or

freezer is more than 10 years old, still plugged in and functioning and measures between 10 to 20 cubic feet. If your appliance meets these requirements, all you need to do is make an appointment for pick up by calling 1-877-49F-RIGO (493-7446) or by completing a form online at www.recyc-frigo.com. A specialized carrier will come to your home and pick up your appliance. A cheque in the amount of \$60 per recycled appliance (maximum of two appliances per household) will be issued to the owner within three weeks following refrigerator or freezer pick

Participating in the RECYC-FRIGO program, means saving energy and helping to conserve the environment.

## Shedding some light on the recycling crisis -Our efforts are always worthwhile

Following the numerous reports mentioning that recyclable materials will be sent to the dump, many citizens of the territory have wondered about the relevance of continuing with recycling efforts. Of course it is important to continue to recyclel Establishing a collection of recyclable materials and forming new habits takes time; we cannot erase years of effort for such a limited crisis.

The recycling crisis that is hitting the sorting centres at the moment is caused by the decrease in Asian demand for recycled materials. Recyclable materials were purchased by China purchased in order to make packaging for products for export. Now, with the financial crisis, fewer products from China are being exported and China has stopped the import of recyclable materials. This brought about a remarkable fall in price on the markets. Usually, a ton of used paper would sell for \$100 on the world markets. However, for several weeks, it is selling for \$10 a ton. Many sorting centers have decided to store their cardboard and paper to wait for the market price to rise again.

According to Recyle-Quebec, to resolve the crisis, the sorting centres should improve their sorting methods in order to respond to the needs of the companies here at home. In effect, the products from the

Quebec sorting centres did not meet the standard of quality for paper as it contained too many contaminants such as plastic, glass or metal. Quebec companies who use recyclable materials prefer to stock up in Ontario or the United States. One of the solutions for this crisis is to improve the sorting methods of the sorting centres or develop local markets.

Another solution to the crisis is to improve the quality of the recyclable materials and increase the rate of recycling. It is therefore very important to continue to recycle and make the effort to do so correctly. If the citizens apply themselves to

sorting correctly, the recyclable materials will be of better quality. This will help to bring an end to the crisis.

The government and the municipalities are working hard to find solutions. The Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks, Mrs. Lise Beauchamp, announced a series of measures aimed to help the Quebec sorting centres. Studies are presently underway to find better solutions for the short and long term. In the meantime, let's continue to recycle!

## Non-Household Waste - Dry Materials

The weekly collection of nonhousehold waste (dry materials) resumed in March. The Municipality will collect these materials on a weekly basis every Tuesday. This service functions on a call-in basis only, please do not dispose of nonhousehold waste by depositing them in front of containers or community mailboxes. You must call the Municipality at 844-1218 to schedule this service. When you call, please give us an itemized list of materials to be collected.

It is important that the

materials to be collected by the Municipality be set out in an organized manner (ex: carpets must be rolled and tied, metal must be sorted, wire must be rolled and tied, etc.)

You may dispose of used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. However, the tires must be separated from the rims.

Please note that vehicle carcasses or frames, tree and brush debris, household garbage and leaves as well as recyclable materials will not be collected during the weekly collections.

For renovation materials, you may not dispose of these in your black garbage bin as the waste management company will not pick up your garbage. We can collect a limited amount of these materials in the non-household waste weekly pick up. You must first place a request with Dany Laberge, Public Works Assistant Director. For major renovations, contact the Municipality to find out where you can dispose of these materials.

# Special Collection for Fallen Leaves and Branches

Bags of leaves are not accepted during the weekly collection of household garbage. The Municipality will hold a special collection on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 12</u>, <u>2009</u>. Bags of leaves should be placed by the roadside in front of your residence.

In order to accommodate our residents, <u>branches</u> that have fallen as a result of inclement weather will also be collected on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 12</u>, <u>2009</u> in restricted quantities. Branches must be left in piles by the roadside.

## GREEN WASTE IS NOT GARBAGE!

It is not accepted in the weekly garbage and recyclable materials collection.

## Information Session and Distribution of Composters

Are you concerned about the environment? You would like to reduce the amount of garbage you generate?

You still have time to register for the information session on domestic composting and take advantage of our special offer to buy a domestic composter at the reduced price of \$42 (a value of \$70).

A minimum number of registrations are required for this activity to take place. Therefore, we invite each and everyone interested in this workshop to

come by the municipal offices to register or send a cheque by mail by May 14<sup>th</sup> 2009, at the latest. The information session is free and without obligation to buy a composter. For complete details on this activity, please visit our website; www.saint-gabriel-devalcartier.ca.

The activity will be held at the Valcartier community center on the 1st of June 2009 (if minimum number of required registrations is achieved). During the conference, you will learn how to make your own compost while enhancing the

value of recycling residual organic waste.

Workshop attendance is optional but you must come and pick up your composter at the Community Center on the night of the activity.



Do You Grasscycle?

Leaving grass clippings on the lawn after mowing, that's grasscyling. These are an excellent source of nutrients for the soil. Grasscycling allows for savings up to 30% in fertilizers.

Spread grass clippings and dead leaves under trees, underbrush and vegetables to keep the ground damp and prevent the growth of weeds. Use grass and leaves in your domestic

composter. Leave grass clippings on your lawn, it is an excellent way of maintaining the health of your lawn and it saves time and money!

## Biological Control of Mosquitoes and Black Flies

GDG Environnement Itée www.gdg.ca has received a mandate for the biological control of mosquitoes and black flies during the 2009 summer season. This operation has the authorization of the Ministère de l'Environnement du Québec. Treatments begin in early spring and will be carried out on several occasions until the end of August by GDG professionals.

GDG team members will tour the Municipality and its surrounding areas on several occasions during the summer season in order to proceed with the treatments. The biologist in charge wishes to inform the population that the insecticide used is completely safe for humans as well as for other living organisms and will be carried out and supervised with professionalism.

In 2009, almost everyone is aware of the risks associated with

the West Nile Virus (WNV), and of the fact that mosquito bites are not only a matter of discomfort but also a question of health. The Ministère de la Santé et des Services Sociaux (MSSS) and the Institut de Santé Publique du Québec (INSPQ) have confirmed the safety of using B.t.i. for the biological control of biting insects. In this context, we call for the collaboration of all citizens in order to permit access to all mosquito-breeding sites.

These treatments are expected to yield results to reduce the number of pests and insects by 80% or more until September 1st, 2009.

GDG's team of professionals will be residing in the Municipality for the duration of the contract, that is, from mid-April until the end of August. The coordinator's name is Mr. Eric Cliche.

#### **SOME PRACTICAL ADVICE:**

To eliminate the artificial breeding areas where biting insects proliferate, the following measures should be taken:

- Start the swimming pool as early as possible – it could produce mosquitoes by the third week of May;
- Keep drain pipes in good repair and cleaned of accumulated debris that prevents the evacuation of rainwater;
- Dispose of old tires and store others in a dry place;
- Overturn small boats or remove the drain on those left upright;
- Remove water accumulated in tarpaulins;
- Wheelbarrows, rain barrels, birdbaths, buckets and containers of all sorts constitute excellent breeding sites for mosquitoes.

Remember that swarms of mosquitoes can be produced every seven to eight days in water that has been left to accumulate.

The Municipality is looking for volunteers to conduct "nuisance tests" for the biological control of mosquitoes and black flies

The effectiveness of the control program is measured by "nuisance tests". All the nuisance tests are performed by the staff of GDG Environnement in the presence of an independent witness. These tests will be done three times a week on the territory. We are in need of witnesses. If you are interested in participating, please let us know by calling 418-844-1218. The duration of the testing process is approximately 15 to 30 minutes.

## The 2009 Provincial Collective Plan of Action to eradicate Ambrosia (Ragweed)

In July of 2009, the Municipality will participate in The Provincial Collective Plan of Action established by the **HerbaNatur Inc.** company.

Our common goal is to permanently eliminate this highly allergenic plant. Pollen from the ragweed plant is largely responsible for symptoms attributed to **Hayfever**. Over 15% of the population in Quebec suffers from Allergic Rhinitis.

Control operations of infected zones such as parks, playgrounds, roadsides, will be carried out by spraying a 100% natural, low impact, environmentally safe product directly onto the plant.

It will be safe for the population to frequent the sites controlled by the ecological herbicide **Adios Ambros®**.

We count on the participation of the entire community in order to reach our goal to permanently eliminate ragweed.

## Here's how you can actively participate in the Action Plan:

- 1. Uproot any ragweed plants on your property.
- 2. Locate the infested zones in your neighbourhood.
- 3. Make your neighbours aware of the Provincial Collective Plan of Action.

This annual collective program aims to reduce pollen levels and this, in the best interest of the local population.

## By-law Concerning Dogs

## Article 6.1 Yearly registration for dog licences

"No guardian can keep a dog inside the limits of the Municipality unless has previously obtained a dog license in accordance with the provisions of by-law no. 121. The cost of the licence applies to each dog. The licence is indivisible and non refundable." Costs are established as follows: \$10.00 for 1st dog -If one (1) dog: \$10.00 \$20.00 for a second (2) dog -If two dogs: \$30.00

\$30.00 for a third (3) dog -If three dogs: \$60.00 \$150.00 for a kennel or more than three dogs

You can obtain a licence for your dog at the municipal offices during office hours.

#### Article 6.2 Number of dogs

"A maximum of three (3) dogs

is authorized per habitation unit, commerce or industry, except in the case of a kennel. A litter or brood can be kept for a period of three (3) months following the birth without the guardian contravening to the present bylaw."

## Article 6.3.3 Tied up in a residential sector

"A dog kept outside of a building must be kept or tied up by means of a device or mechanism (fastener, leash, fence, etc.) preventing it from exiting the guardian's property."

## Article 6.5 Guard of a dog in a public place

"Under reserve of this by-law's particular provisions, a dog may not be kept in a public place unless it is controlled and kept on a leash by it's guardian. The dog can not be left alone at any moment, regardless if it is attached or not....

...No guardian may let his dog lie in a public place in a way that blocks access or passage to people or vehicles."

Article 6.10 Nuisance

- "Constitutes a nuisance the fact of keeping:
- A) A dog which has already bitten another animal or a human being;
- B) A dog of the following races; b u l l - t e r r i e r, Staffordshire bull-terrier, American bull-terrier or American Staffordshire terrier, or a hybrid dog issued from one of the aforementioned races, commonly named "pit-bull";
- C) An animal non indigenous to the territory of Quebec."

#### Article 7.1 Sanctions

"Whoever contravenes or permits one to contravene to a

provision of the present by-law commits an infraction and is liable, for a first infraction, to which a fine in the amount of, in the case of a physical person, is a minimum of \$100.00 and a maximum of \$1,000.00 and, in the case of a moral person, a minimum of \$150.00 and a maximum of \$2,000.00.

In the case of a subsequent offence, the offender is liable to a fine of which the amount is, in the case of a physical person, a minimum of \$250.00 and a maximum of \$2,000.00 and, in the case of a moral person, a minimum of \$350.00 and a maximum of \$4,000.00.

In all cases, the fees are added to the fine.

If the infraction is continuous, this continuation constitutes, day after day, a separate infraction and the fine decreed for this infraction can be imposed for each day the infraction lasts."

## Important Reminder -Winter shelters

As of April 30th all temporary winter garages of light construction (mobile wood panels, tarpaulin canvas / vinyl), winter shelters & snow fences must be taken down. These temporary garages and snow fences are authorized from October 15th to April 30th. This law applies to all residents. In all fairness and for the respect of your neighbourhood, you must comply with this By-law.



## Summer labourer - Public Works Department

Maintenance of the municipal properties and various manual work. You must have a valid drivers licence to apply for this job.

- 5 days per week starting June 1st;

-Must be 16 years of age or

older;

-Must be a student returning to school in the fall of 2009.

Priority will be given to candidates living in Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier.

## Fire Safety Services

## FIRE PREVENTION VISITS

The Fire Safety Services Department must carry out prevention/information visits in all residential dwellings within the Municipality during a five year period. This means that 20% of residences will be visited annually. The goal of these visits is to answer your questions and give you pertinent information concerning this law in order to reduce fire hazards.

To complete it's mission, the fire prevention committee asks

for your collaboration in order to perform these visits. THESE VISITS WILL BE HELD BETWEEN 9 AM AND 8 PM THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. The fire prevention officers who will visit you will be wearing their uniform and clearly identified as members of the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services. Please note that you can refuse to give access to your residence, but remember that these are security and prevention visits.

## Barbecue Safety Tips

- Barbecues are for outdoor use only.
- Only use charcoal briquettes, use only charcoal lighter fluids that a re specially manufactured for this purpose.
- To light the charcoal briquettes sprinkle them with charcoal lighter fluid, follow the instructions on the lighter fluid container.
- Never add additional fluid after igniting your barbecues.
- Place your barbecue away from combustibles before lighting.
- Before storing your barbecue, dispose of the ashes by soaking them in water and place them in a covered metal container.
- ₩ When buying a gas barbecue, make sure it

meets safety standards.

Before each use check for leaks by applying soap and water to all connections, hoses and cylinder head. If bubbles form, you have a leak. Tighten the connections or replace the defective part. A trained professional should replace defective parts.

#### Before Lighting Your Grill:

- Make sure the lid is open to prevent gas build up
- Never ignite the grill with a match or cigarette lighter.
- Keep your grill away from combustibles when cooking.
- When storing make sure the tank and the grill are both turned off
- 🖺 Never store a gas grill

#### 9-1-1

You must always dial this number <u>first and foremost</u> when you need help in an emergency situation (418-844-0911 with your mobile). You must not call the Municipality, a parent, or neighbour, since you will lose valuable time to allow emergency services to respond. The municipal office does not dispatch emergency vehicles to the site, this is done strictly by 9-1-1 service operators.

#### When Taking Your Tank To Be Refilled Remember To:

- Travel directly to and from the refill station.
- Keep the tank in an upright position at all times.
- ★ Keep a window open at all times to avoid breathing toxic fumes.
- Make sure your tank is equipped with a safety plug.
- Never leave a tank in an enclosed space such as the trunk of your car.
- Never smoke while refilling, reconnecting or transporting the tank.

## OPEN AIR FIRES AND THE INDICATOR PANEL NEAR THE MUNICIPAL GARAGE

Don't forget to consult the indicator panel in front of the municipal garage - this will inform you if open air fires are permitted.

Many materials should not be burned as they are hazardous to human and environmental health:

➡ Domestic garbage, rugs or carpets, electric wires, petroleum products, plastic, pressure treated lumber, rubber, roofing shingles, Styrofoam, tires, animal cadavers or manure. 
