VALCARTIER CABLE

The annual fees for the 2009-2010 year are due in full by August 1st at the latest (for services received between September 1st, 2009 and August 31st, 2010). It is still possible to make up to 4 monthly payments beginning in May and ending in August. Payments can be made by any of the following methods: cash, check, direct payment at our offices, by Internet or telephone at any of the following financial institutions (your client number is your reference number); Caisse Populaire Desjardins, Royal Bank of Canada, National Bank of Canada, CIBC, BMO Bank of Montreal.

We would also like to remind you that you can call 418-844-3666 at all times to report a cable outage or reception problems and leave your address as well the nature of the problem. A technician regularly checks messages 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. A technician should respond to your call within 48 hours.

Did you know that you can consult the programming for Valcartier Cable channels on the Internet? Just go to http://affiliate.zap2it.com and click on CHANGE MY LOCATION at the top of the programming schedule then enter your postal code and click on Valcartier Cable. Please note that French language channels have French descriptions.

HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE RECYCLING DEPOT (HHW) ON May 30th

The Municipality will offer a hazardous household waste recycling depot, free of charge, on <u>Sunday, May 30th from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.</u> at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier).

You must bring your dangerous materials to the depot location.

Here is the list of materials that will be recycled on that day:

PAINTS

Paints:

- sold by retail businesses (100 ml containers and larger)
- sold by wholesale businesses (170 L containers and larger intended for architectural use)
- primers and paints (latex, alkyd, enamel and other)
- metal or anti-rust paint
- aluminium paint
- dyes
- varnishes
- lacquers
- products or preparations for the treatment of wood (preservatives) or masonry (acrylic sealers for driveways)
- signalisation paints (those available in retail businesses)

Aerosol paints

ORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acetone, adhesives, aerosols, solid fire starter, rubbing alcohol, starter fluid, glue, wax, antifreeze, caulking, dye, plastic cement, solid fuel, fondue fuel, lock de-icer, degreasing agents, oil stain remover, paint thinner, petroleum distillate, ink, epoxy, gasoline, ethylene glycol, roofing tar, motor grease, heating and lamp oil, lubricant, methanol, petroleum, polish, Polyfilla, leather, suede or vinyl protector, liquid resin, silicone sealant, wallpaper remover, shoe dye, turpentine, toluene.

INORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acids, bases, oxidizing agents, batteries, pesticides and insecticides

Fluorescent compact light bulbs (CFL)



If you are not sure if a product that you would like to dispose of is on the list, bring it in to the depot and the trained employees will help you.

<u>Each container must be intended for residential use only. All products must be in their original containers.</u> For safety reasons, do not mix products.

During this collection, you may also take in your used oil, used oil filters and oil containers (non commercial use only). This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only.

MAY 2010 IS TREE AND FOREST MONTH DISTRIBUTION OF TREE SAPLINGS ON MAY 30th

The Municipality will hand out a tree when you take in your HHW on Sunday, May 30th.

Thousands of tree saplings will be distributed in the region to students in several schools as well as to citizens of several municipalities for replanting projects realized for educational or community purposes.

Distribution of these tree saplings is coordinated by the Association forestière du Québec métropolitain (AFQM). The goal of this distribution is to raise

awareness in the population and, particularly with the younger population, of the importance and respect we owe to trees and forests.

THE GREAT CELEBRATION OF NATURE

The 15th edition of the Great Celebration of Nature, organised by the National Battlefields Commission, will be held on Sunday May 16th on the Plains of Abraham from 11:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The AFQM will be on site to distribute free tree saplings and lead some

workshops on planting and caring for trees. Visitors will have a variety of captivating and enriching activities to choose from. Besides a unique visit to the Plains of Abraham greenhouses, the population will have the opportunity to consult with specialists from several fields such as horticultural, ecological, agricultural and other fields therefore expanding their general knowledge.

COMPOSTERS

The Municipality will not be offering a composting workshop nor distributing composters this year since it has come to our attention that the knowledge level of citizens concerning domestic composting has greatly evolved and registration was at an all time low last spring. The Municipality will however be offering a subsidy of \$15,00 per composter to residents who would like to acquire a domestic composter which can be purchased at any hardware store. Bring your proof of purchase (2010) and proof of address to the municipal office during business hours for reimbursement. (There is a limit of two composters per family.)

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR FALLEN LEAVES

Bags of leaves are not accepted during the weekly collection of household garbage. The Municipality will hold a special collection on Tuesday, May 11th, 2010. Bags of leaves should be placed by the roadside in front of your residence.

DID YOU KNOW?

GREEN WASTE IS NOT GARBAGE!

It is not accepted in the weekly garbage and recyclable materials collection.

The Municipality is looking for volunteers to conduct "nuisance tests" for the biological control of mosquitoes and black flies

The effectiveness of the control program is measured by "nuisance tests". All the nuisance tests are performed by the staff of GDG Environnement in the presence of an independent witness. These tests will be done three times a week on the territory. We are in need of witnesses. If you are interested in participating, please let us know by calling 418-844-1218. The duration of the testing process is approximately 15 to 30 minutes.

NON-HOUSEHOLD WASTE - DRY MATERIALS

The weekly collection of nonhousehold waste (dry materials) resumed in March. The Municipality will collect these materials on a weekly Tuesday. This basis every service functions on a call-in basis only, please do not deposit non-household waste in front of containers or community mailboxes. You must call the Municipality at 418-844-1218 to schedule this service. When you call, please give us an itemized list of materials to be collected.

It is important that the materials to be collected by the Municipality be set out in

an organized manner (ex: carpets must be rolled and tied, metal must be sorted, wire must be rolled and tied, etc.)

You may dispose of used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. However, the tires must be separated from the rims.

Please note that vehicle carcasses or frames, tree and brush debris, household garbage and leaves as well as recyclable materials will not be collected during the weekly collections.

For renovation materials, you

may not dispose of these in your black garbage bin as waste management company not pick up your garbage. We can collect a limited amount of these materials in the non-household waste weekly pick up. You must first place a request with Dany Public Works Laberae, Assistant Director, For major renovations, contact the Municipality to find out where you can dispose of these materials.

BIOLOGICAL CONTROL OF MOSQUITOES AND BLACK FLIES



GDG team members will tour the Municipality and its surrounding areas on several occasions during the summer season in order to proceed with the treatments. The biologist in charge wishes to inform the population that the insecticide used is completely safe for humans as well as for other living organisms and will be carried out and supervised with

professionalism.

The Ministère de la Santé et des Services Sociaux (MSSS) and the Institut de Santé Publique du Québec (INSPQ) have confirmed the safety of using B.t.i. for the biological control of biting insects. In this context, we call for the collaboration of all citizens in order to permit access to all mosquito-breeding sites.

These treatments are expected to yield results to reduce the number of pests and insects by 80% or more until September 1st, 2010.

GDG's team of professionals will be residing in the Municipality for the duration of the contract, that is, from mid-April until the end of August. The coordinator's name is Mr. Eric Cliche.

SOME PRACTICAL ADVICE:

To eliminate the artificial breeding areas where biting insects proliferate, the following measures should be taken:

- Start the swimming pool as early as possible – it could produce mosquitoes by the third week of May;
- Keep drain pipes in good repair and cleaned of accumulated debris that prevents the evacuation of rainwater;
- Dispose of old tires and store others in a dry place;
- Overturn small boats or remove the drain on those left upright;
- •Remove water accumulated in tarpaulins;
- Wheelbarrows, rain barrels, birdbaths, buckets and containers of all sorts constitute excellent breeding sites for mosquitoes.
- Remember that swarms of mosquitoes can be produced every seven to eight days in water that has been left to accumulate.



THE 2010 PROVINCIAL COLLECTIVE PLAN OF ACTION TO ERADICATE AMBROSIA (RAGWEED)

In July of 2010, the Municipality will participate in The Provincial Collective Plan of Action established by the **HerbaNatur Inc.** company.

Our common goal is to permanently eliminate this highly allergenic plant. Pollen from the ragweed plant is largely responsible for symptoms attributed to Hayfever. Over 15% of the population in Quebec suffers from Allergic Rhinitis.

Control operations of infected zones such as parks, playgrounds, roadsides, will be carried out by spraying a 100% natural, low impact, environmentally safe product directly onto the plant.

It will be safe for the population to frequent the sites controlled by the ecological herbicide Adios Ambros®.

We count on the participation of the entire community in

order to reach our goal to permanently eliminate ragweed.

Here's how you can actively participate in the Action Plan:

Uproot any ragweed plants on your property.

Locate the infested zones in your neighbourhood.

Make your neighbours aware of the Provincial Collective Plan of Action.



This annual collective program aims to reduce pollen levels and this, in the best interest of the local population.

The socioeconomic impact related to respiratory allergies amounts to 250 million dollars annually.

DRINKING WATER PRESERVATION PROGRAM - YOU'RE GREEN BUT ARE YOU BLUE?

Being green is definitely stylish at the moment, but what about being blue? This year, Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier will participate in the Drinking Water Economy Program (PEEP) which suggests we make blue the current trend. To achieve this, citizens are invited to make daily efforts in order to diminish drinking water consumption. Whether this is accomplished by exchanging the watering hose

for a broom or using low flow aerators in the bathroom, every method is good. From May 25th to August 13th, the Municipality of Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier is going blue!

We invite you to find out about this program in order to learn more about daily water consumption and what you can do individually to contribute to the preservation of this important resource. Moreover,

watch for the PEEP's visit in your neighbourhood and the documentation that will be made available (in French only).

To support the program and show your commitment to preserving the drinking water supply, you can join the Facebook group and participate in the Drop-Count Day (Journée Compte-gouttes) which will be held on July 15th.

FAULTY STREET LIGHTS?

The Public Works Department requests your cooperation in order to replace faulty street lights. If you notice a faulty street light within the limits of the Municipality, please call 418-844-1218 and leave the coordinates of the faulty light with the receptionist or leave a message with our answering service. Please note that repairs are carried out every two weeks.

EMPLOYMENT OFFER - PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance of the municipal properties and various manual work as a summer labourer. You must have a valid drivers licence to apply for this job.

Conditions for employment:

- 5 days per week starting May 31st;

-Must be 16 years of age or older;

-Must be a student returning to school in the fall of 2010.

Priority will be given to candidates living in Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier.

REMINDER - WINTER SHELTERS

As of April 30th all temporary garages of light winter construction (mobile wood panels, tarpaulin canvas / winter shelters & vinyl), snow fences must be taken down. These temporary garages and snow fences are authorized from October 15th to April 30th. This law applies to all residents. In all fairness and for the respect of your neighbourhood, you must comply with this By-law.



FIRST RESPONDERS - NEW VEHICLE



In February 2010, the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services received delivery of a 2010 Chevrolet Tahoe.

The primary use of this vehicle will be for the First Responders. Now, when a citizen dials 9-1-1 for a medical emergency, the First Responders will arrive with this vehicle.

When the First Responders are called to a medical emergency, a maximum of two First Responders will intervene with the patient. A third First Responder, with a radio,

communicates with the ambulance service and gathers information from the family members.

This vehicle will also be used for Fire Emergencies, Water/Boat Rescue, Fire Prevention and other duties related fire services.

Should you have any questions or if you require further information, please feel free to call 418-844-1218 and we would be glad to assist you.

FIRE PREVENTION VISITS

The Fire Safety Services Department must carry out prevention/information visits in all residential dwellings within the Municipality during a five year period. This means that 20% of residences will be visited annually. The goal of these visits is to answer your questions and give you pertinent information concerning this law in order to reduce fire hazards.

To complete it's mission, the fire prevention committee asks for your collaboration in order to perform these visits.

THESE VISITS WILL BE HELD BETWEEN 9 AM AND 8 PM THROUGHOUT THE YEAR.

The fire prevention officers who will visit you will be wearing their uniform and clearly identified as members of the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services. Please note that you can refuse to give access to your residence, but remember that these are security and prevention visits.

MESSAGE FROM FIRE SAFETY SERVICES

Spring clean-up is under way in Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier. The Fire Department would like to remind you of a few tips to insure that your clean-up proceeds safely.

Although, the Municipality will pick up the majority of non-household garbage, wood products, branches and grass must be disposed of by the resident. In the past, open air burning of wood was common practice, in part because there weren't many options for disposing of waste. Nowadays, we know that the burning of grass is unnecessary and dangerous as it is difficult to control and burning can harm the environment by releasing contaminants into the air. Today, we have more appropriate alternatives for disposing of waste such as composting, chipping, or reuse and so burning of waste should be considered as a last resort.

PLEASE CONSULT THE FIRE INDICATOR PANEL SITUATED IN FRONT OF THE MUNICIPAL GARAGE TO KNOW IF OPEN AIR OUTDOOR FIRES ARE PERMITTED.

Many materials should not be burned as they pose a threat to human and environmental health. They are: domestic garbage, electrical carpets. wire. petroleum products, plastics, pressure treated lumber, rubber, roofing shingles, Styrofoam, tires, tarpaper, cadavers or manure. The majority of these materials can be collected and disposed of by the Municipality. Please call 418-844-1218 to make an appointment.

OPEN AIR FIRE SAFETY

Open air fires should only be lit under the following conditions:

- The fire is contained within a fireplace, BBQ, or any other installation designed for fire (metal barrel with a metal grate over top, or other apparatus made of n o n - c o m b u s t i b l e materials).
- •The above mentioned containers should not be within 4 meters of any trees, bushes or structures.
- You should not start a fire or maintain a fire if the winds exceed 20km/h.
- You should always have a shovel, a pail of water or garden hose ready to extinguish the fire at all times.
- Be courteous to your neighbours, inform them of your burning.
- Avoid burning near roadways, as smoke hampers drivers visibility.
- Burn dry materials only.

NEVER LEAVE YOUR FIRE UNATTENDED.

VALLÉE JEUNESSE

History

Vallée Jeunesse was developed in 2004 in the region of Quebec with this desire to intervene actively and concretely with young people who are soon to be expelled from their school.

In order for Vallée Jeunesse Québec to pursue their educational mission, the Frères Maristes community has made available close to 35 acres of land with access to the Jacques-Cartier river. The program takes place on this property, situated in Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier.

Indeed, we are of the opinion that this location is ideal to offer quality services to young people in the process of suspension or expulsion from school. Such setting in itself carries a larger meaning in order to support the development of the individual, and more particularly, that of young people experiencing important difficulties.

Project Description

Vallée Jeunesse Québec has developed three intervention axes;

-i- : Academic Intervention Program for 11 - 16 year olds

Identify "potential future dropouts" in order to offer an intense and specialized intervention out of the regular educational context. In collaboration with the Quebec region's school boards, assume a leadership milieu in the matter of social and educational dropouts. These services are offered to young people and their parents, in collaboration with partners, including the school of origin, social services, community organizations, and resource persons from the youth's immediate environment.

-ii- : Recovery Program for Families

A reference and welcoming

process has been established for families from the Quebec region so that they may experience a break, in the heart of nature, in a supervised setting. Recovery in this sense, is a recommended or proposed rest period to promote relaxation, reflection and maybe contribute towards the improvement of a family situation.

-iii-: Recreational Program:

Over the past 50 years the Valcartier site has welcomed youngsters from what was previously known as Ville Vanier, led by their recreational staff. Approximately 450 young people benefit from the infrastructures and part of grounds independent basis while an exchange of services is arranged for chores such as mowing the lawn and pool maintenance among others.

Vallée Jeunesse has improved the site in order to



be able to offer recreational facilities to the local and regional communities. There are nature interpretation trails, hiking tracks and other recreational amenities available to the community and recreational organizations.
