GIANT HOGWEED



If you believe that you have been in contact with Giant Hogweed or if you would like to have more information on how to deal with its burns, please call **Info-Santé at 8-1-1.** Giant Hogweed is an invasive plant that can potentially be dangerous to human health. It was introduced into North America in the beginning of the last century for horticultural reason and first reported in Quebec in 1990. Its sap contains toxins which are activated by ultraviolet light. Contact with its sap, combined with exposure to light, can cause lesions similar to burns. Also, Giant Hogweed is very invasive and colonizes rapidly in many areas. It inhibits the growth of indigenous plants and can cause a loss of biodiversity. It represents both a risk to health and to the environment.

For these reasons it is very important to limit the propagation of this plant, to never sell, sow, plant, grow or transport it. When it is present, it is best to locate and eliminate the plant.

DESCRIPTION OF GIANT HOGWEED

Giant Hogweed is a giant herbaceous plant able to attain a height of 5 meters, is perennial and is from the Apiaceae family. It prefers cool humid habitats. It can easily propagate if used for landscaping purposes, where it has been used in the past, and colonize areas such as river banks, ditches, railroads and roads. It can also develop in prairies and vacant lots as well as farmers' fields. Because it produces a vast quantity of seeds, it disperses rapidly and sometimes overruns large areas. Given the invasive character of this plant and its toxic properties, **it is essential to stop its spreading and avoid exposure to it.** To properly identify the plant and learn its correct and safe elimination procedure, consult the Ministry of Sustainable Development, the Environment and Parks' website (www.mddep.gouv.qc.ca).

GIANT HOGWEED NOTIFICATION

To notify of the existence of Giant Hogweed, please call the Municipality, or call the Ministry of Sustainable Development, the Environment and Parks' information center at 1 800 561-1616. Photograph the plant in order to confirm its presence by the Ministry's professionals.

YOUR RESPONSABILITIES AS A DOG OWNER

Dogs are "Man's best friend". They are intelligent animals and enjoyed by many. Unfortunately, at times they may be a nuisance to others. The Municipality would like to remind you that as an owner of one or more dogs, you are fully responsible for respecting the municipal by-law concerning the right to keep an animal on your property. By-law number 158 is available for consultation upon request. Here are some excerpts of this regulation:

- As proprietor or keeper of an animal, you must not let your pet roam freely in a public area (park, street) or onto private property, other than your own, without the consent of the property owner or occupant. NOTE: As the Municipality is proprietor of all public streets/parks/ public areas, it is forbidden to let your animal roam freely in these areas.
- All dogs must be registered with the Municipality. The medal or dog tag is valid from January 1st to December 31st and must be renewed annually.
- A maximum of three (3) dogs are permitted per dwelling unit.
- A dog which is kept outside of a building must be retained by a device (such as a leash, enclosed fence, etc.) preventing the animal from leaving the owner's property.
- A dog owner must keep their animal on a leash at all times if circulating in a public area (including a street). This leash must be no longer than two (2) meters.
- Nuisance: The following constitutes a nuisance if you are the keeper or owner of
 - 1. A dog that has already bitten an animal or a human being.
 - 2. A dog of the following breeds: bull-terrier, staffordshire bull-terrier, american bull-terrier, american staffordshire terrier, or a crossbreed from one of the previously mentioned breeds commonly called « pit-bull ».
 - 3. An animal not indigenous to the Quebec territory.
- In the case of violation to the by-law, the minimum fine is \$100 plus costs, up to a maximum of \$1,000 plus costs.
- For the territory of the Municipality, the application of by-laws and fines are entrusted to the municipal inspector and the Sureté du Québec police force, with the support of the "Société protectrice des animaux" (animal protection society).

We wish to remind you that in the case of a nuisance, it is highly recommended initially to attempt to discuss the problem with the dog owner. Often, friendly dialogue and respect between neighbours are the most effective ways to solve a problem or inconvenience. Living in a society denotes tolerance and respect of others. Thank you for your cooperation!

WINTER GARAGES AND SNOW FENCES

Winter shelters are considered temporary in light of their construction (mobile wood panels or canvas) and must be dismantled after their period of use in accordance with the established by-law. Winter garages and snow fences are authorized in all zones, from October 1st to April 30th, as long as the following conditions have been met:

- Winter garages must be located only on properties where a main building already exists;
- Winter garages may be located up to 3 meters (9.84 ft) from the road and must never encroach upon the public right-of-way;
- Winter garages must be installed in a parking area or on an access route to a parking area;
- A minimum distance of 3 meters (9.84 ft) must be left between a winter garage and a fire hydrant.

Please note that fines have been foreseen in case of violation to municipal by-laws.



SOIL EROSION



The Municipality's Urbanism Department would like to inform you that within a period of 24 months following

construction of your residence, new proprietors must landscape (levelling, sowing and plantation) their land in such a way that no soil is exposed on the property. Particular attention will be paid to this matter during the next months in order to sort out cases surpassing the 24 month period. Moreover, we strongly encourage you to stabilize roadside canals with turf in order to stop the erosion that is visible at numerous areas along the side of our roads. In case of violation to this law, the minimum fine is \$200 per day as stipulated in the by-law.

CAUTION ADVISED AT CLARK'S BRIDGE

At the beginning of this school year, the Public Works Department urges you to be careful when crossing Clark's bridge with your vehicle, since the new traffic sign is not yet known by all who use this road. We would like to remind you that the new traffic sign indicates that you should:

« Yield the right-of-way to oncoming traffic »



Which means that traffic going South (towards

<u>Quebec City</u>) does <u>not have to stop</u> while traffic <u>going North (towards</u> <u>Redmond Road</u>) is <u>obliged to yield the</u> <u>way</u> to oncoming traffic.

BY-LAW REGARDING CULVERTS AND PRIVATE ENTRANCES

By-law #166 for culverts and private entrances (municipal roads)

The objective of this new regulation is to minimize damages created from streaming rainwater and create a standard installation process. In short, any new private entrance from a public road, and every new or rebuilt culvert must be done in accordance to this By-law. A permit and a security deposit are necessary prior to any work being done. Detailed information is available at the

RENTAL OF TABLES AND CHAIRS :

Any person wishing to rent this equipment must furnish a

security deposit of \$100 in addition to paying a basic rental fee of \$25 regardless of the quantity rented. It is the responsibility of the person renting the equipment to insure that the equipment is in good condition before and upon its return. The Municipality will not deliver or pick up tables and chairs that have been rented.

HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE RECYCLING DEPOT (HHW) ON SEPTEMBER 25TH

The Municipality will offer a hazardous household waste recycling depot, free of charge, on <u>Sunday, September 25th from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.</u> at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier). *You must bring your dangerous materials to the depot location.*

If you are not sure if a product that you would like to dispose of is on the list, bring it in to the depot and the trained employees will help you.

Each container must be intended for residential use only. All products must be in their original containers. For safety reasons, do not mix products.

During this collection, you may also take in your used oil, used oil filters and oil containers (**non commercial use only**). This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only. Thank you for your active participation for a clean and healthy environment!

SPECIAL COLLECTION OF LEAVES

<u>**Bags of leaves**</u> will not be picked up during the weekly collection of household garbage.

The Municipality will organize a special collection on *Thursday, November 3rd, 2011.* Bags of leaves should be placed by the side of the road in front of your residence.

No reservation required.



2011 MUNICIPAL TAXES

The 3rd and final instalment for 2011 municipal taxes is due on September 1st, 2011. The privilege to pay in three instalments cannot be granted unless each instalment is paid in full by the due date. Interest and penalties will apply to the account's totality for all late payments.

Methods of payment:

In cash (at the counter), by cheque made in the name of Municipalité de Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier (at the counter, by mail or in the night deposit), by direct payment (at the counter) and by Internet, by phone or at the ATM at your financial institution.

You will receive your annual municipal tax bill for 2012 during the first week of March.

BULK WASTE (DRY MATERIALS)

The weekly collection of non-household waste (dry materials) is held every Tuesday until December with the exception of the last week of November when the collection will take place on Thursday. Starting the first week of December and this, for the winter season (December, January and February), the collection will take place the first Thursday of each month.

This service functions on a <u>call-in basis only. Please do not</u> <u>deposit non-household waste in front of containers or</u> <u>community mailboxes</u>. You must call the Municipality at 418 844-1218 to request this service and give us an itemized list of materials to be picked up. You may also register for the collection on the Municipality's website (www.saint-gabriel-de-valcartier.ca) on the home page in the section "Online Request".

It is important that these materials be sorted and set out in an organized manner (ex: carpets rolled and tied, metal sorted, wire rolled and tied, etc.).

You may dispose of used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. However, the tires must be separated from the rims.

Please note that vehicle carcasses or frames, tree and brush debris, household garbage and leaves as well as recyclable materials will not be collected during these weekly pick ups.

You may not dispose of renovation materials in your regular garbage bin as the waste management company will not pick up your garbage. We can pick up a limited amount of these materials in the non-household waste weekly pick up. You must first place a request with Dany Laberge, person responsible for Public Works. For major renovations, contact the Municipality to find out where you can dispose of these materials.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING CONTAINERS

We would like to remind residents that large garbage and recycling containers located on a number of non-municipalized streets are there for the use of residents who do not have door to door

collection for garbage and recycling. Because they do not have rolling bins, the Municipality has installed large garbage and recycling bins for their use only. When residents who benefit from door to door collection use these containers, those with the right to use them cannot dispose of their waste since the containers are full.

Please be civil and respectful towards your co-citizens and do not use these containers if they are not meant for you.

Notice to Sommet Bleu Development and Domaine William Neilson residents

To avoid the nuisance of wild animals getting into your garbage, all household waste must be deposited inside and not next to the containers put at your disposal.

Please note that the g a r b a g e r e m o v a l company will

not pick up garbage which has been left next to the containers. If containers are full, we ask that you please wait until next collection day.

As for the recycling, you must fold or cut cardboard boxes before depositing them in the recycling bins in order to avoid filling these up too quickly.

To dispose of dry materials, please contact the municipal office.

FIRE SAFETY SERVICES - TO SERVE YOU BETTER!



The Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services is pleased to announce the installation in July by the

Public Works Department of an underground water reservoir for fire protection in the north sector of the Municipality near the cement bridge (Redmond Road).

With the implementation of the Municipal Fire Safety Coverage Plan, the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services conducted a study of the available water supply needed in case of a fire. In an emergency, the proximity of a dependable water supply year round for firefighting in rural areas not serviced by hydrants is very important. The Municipal Fire Safety Coverage Plan requirement for adequate water supply for a fire is a minimum of 20,000 imperial gallons of water accessible 365 days year. This requirement has been met and the new reservoir is now considered as a dry fire hydrant.

This new dry hydrant in the northwestern sector of the Municipality, now gives us improved firefighting capabilities in an area identified as having an inadequate water supply.

Of course we hope that this installation is very seldom used however we can be assured that in the event of a fire in this area we have water close by.

HEATING WITH A WOOD STOVE: BE RESPONSIBLE!

Enjoy the benefits of your wood fire in comfort just by taking a few simple precautions. Otherwise, in the blink of an eye, those warm friendly flames in your fireplace or wood stove could turn into a devastating fire. You can easily prevent dangerous situations such as chimney fires by taking the proper safety measures.

Here are some good tips on ways to burn cleaner wood fires.

Creosote - a crusty deposit left behind by the smoke that drifts up your chimney - can ignite into a dangerous fire when it builds up. To reduce its accumulation:

- Burn only clean, well-seasoned wood that has been split and dried properly. Dry wood lights faster, burns better and produces less smoke than "green" wood - a major culprit in creosote build-up.
- Think twice before you chop up that old coffee table and toss it

into your wood stove. Burning • garbage, plastic, particleboard, plywood, salted driftwood or any other painted or treated wood releases a toxic cloud of chemicals and can build up creosote.

blaze...

- The best way to start your fire is with newspaper and dry kindling. Never try to get a blaze roaring with gasoline, kerosene or more firepower than vou bargained for.
- Remove ashes from your stove or fireplace regularly and store them safe area away from your house. The sparks in hot ashes can easily re-ignite fires.
- Keep all household items drapes, furniture, newspaper and books - away from the heat and the stray sparks of your woodstove or fireplace.

Protect floors from sparks with a properly fitted screen around your fireplace. A decorative screen does not provide protection.

Detection devices save lives!

Don't let a small spark ignite a big Install carbon monoxide detectors and smoke alarms, as required by the National Fire Code of Canada, and keep a fire extinguisher nearby. You should never smell smoke in your house. If you do, it usually means your wood stove or fireplace system charcoal starter - you will get isn't venting properly - perhaps the chimney is blocked, a damper is faulty or the fireplace is competing with your range hood. Not only are these fire hazards, but they could also lead in a covered metal container in a to deadly carbon monoxide poisoning.



Night deposit (only checks are accepted) : You may deposit your registration in the night deposit box at the municipal complex, 1743 Boulevard Valcartier.

In person : Checks, cash or direct payment are accepted.

Payment by check: Payments by check must be made in one payment dated September 15th, 2011 and in the name of "Municipalité de Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier". For amounts exceeding \$125, it is possible to make two instalments; the first for September 15th, 2011 and the second for October 15th, 2011. For a check returned for insufficient funds, a fee of \$10 will be applicable and the payment will have to be made in cash.

• CPR is a skill that could very well save the life of someone suffering from cardiac arrest (which occurs when the heart stops beating all of a sudden and the person stops breathing).

- Approximately 40 000 cardiac arrests occur each year in Canada and every minute that passes, survival chances for the victim diminish by 10 %.
- Over 80 % of cardiac arrests occur at home or in a public place and less than 5% of victims survive.
- Research shows that between 35 and 55% of cardiac arrests occur in the presence of witnesses, often a family member or a friend, but that few victims receive **CPR**.

Once the heart stops beating, every second counts: knowing how to react and what to do in this type of situation could increase the chances of survival and recovery by 30% or more.


