

MUNICIPAL TAXES

FINAL PAYMENT OF 2018 MUNICIPAL TAXES

We remind you that the third and final payment is due on September 1st, 2018, after which, interest fees will apply.

Payment methods:

In cash (at the counter), by cheque made in the name of Municipalité de Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier (at the counter, by mail or in the night deposit box), by debit payment (at the counter) and by Internet or at the ATM at your financial institution.

The 2019 annual tax bill will be mailed the first week of March.

THE ASSESSMENT ROLL AND YOU!

This year, the three-year assessment roll for the years 2019, 2020, 2021 will be deposited at the latest on September 15th, 2018 by the evaluation firm Groupe Altus. Public Notice of this deposit will then be published.

According to the Ministère des Affaires municipales et de l'Occupation du territoire (MAMOT), here are the most frequently asked questions regarding municipal property assessment as well as their answers.

What is an ASSESSMENT ROLL?

The assessment roll is a resume of the inventory of properties situated on the territory of a local

municipality. Its main use consists of indicating, for municipal and school taxation purposes, the value of every property based on its real value.

What is the REAL VALUE?

The real value or market value of a property is its exchange value on the free and open competitive market. In other words, it is the most probable price that a buyer will accept to pay if the property were for sale.

WHEN does an assessment role come into effect?

The assessment roll comes into effect on the 1st of January of the first exercise for which it is prepared.

What is the DURATION of the roll?

The evaluator prepares the assessment roll every three years and for three consecutive financial exercises.

This means that unless modifications are made to the property, its real value registered in the roll remains the same for the duration of the roll, being three years.

Can the assessment roll be MODIFIED during these 3 years?

At its updating, the assessment roll may be modified for various reasons, notably in the cases of renovation or expansion of a property.

IS YOUR CIVIC NUMBER VISIBLE FROM THE STREET?

"When you are out driving around, we invite you to pay particular attention to the identification of civic numbers on buildings. You will notice that on many buildings the civic numbers are difficult to read, or even absent.

The civic number of a building is not a decorative item or useful only for the post office. This number is the main reference for the rapid identification of a place by emergency responders, day and night".

The municipal by-law specifies the visibility of a civic number as such:

"Every building must be identified by a distinct civic number in Arabic numerals, or in letters, readable horizontally, visible from the street at all times."

It is in this spirit that the Municipality will seek the collaboration of the citizens, in the coming months, to ensure that all buildings are well identified, in accordance with municipal by-law. You will also receive an informative pamphlet to this effect.

PORTABLE SPEED DISPLAY

In order to raise the population's awareness of the dangers associated with speeding, this apparatus will be placed in alternating locations throughout the territory. The display unit registers data concerning the recorded speeds and the Municipality sends this data to the Sûreté du Québec in order to target



and increase monitoring in areas where speed limits are exceeded. At the same time, we invite you, dear citizens, to reduce your speed while driving for the welfare and safety of everyone!

REMINDER—WINTER SHELTERS

Winter shelters for either vehicles or for pedestrians at the entrance of a building, as well as snow fences and other winter



protection are authorized in all zones from October 1st to April 30th the following year.

BULK WASTE PICKUP

The collection of non-household waste (dry materials) is held weekly until the end of November. Starting the first week of December and, for the winter season (December, January and February), the collection will take place the first Thursday of each month. This service functions on a call-in basis only. Please do not deposit non-household waste in front of containers or community mailboxes. You must call the Municipality at 418 844-1218 to request this service and provide an itemized list of materials to be picked up or register for the collection online (www.saint-gabriel-de-valcartier.ca).

It is important that these materials be sorted and organized (ex: carpets rolled and tied, metal sorted, wire rolled and tied, etc.).

You may dispose of used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. You may also dispose of cooking or frying oil in their original container or in a labeled clear plastic container.

Please note that vehicle carcasses or frames, tree and brush debris, household garbage and leaves as well as recyclable materials will not be collected during these weekly pick ups.

You may not dispose of renovation materials in your regular garbage bin as the waste management company will not pick up your garbage. We can pick up a limited amount of these materials in the non-household waste weekly pick up. You must first place a request with Dany Laberge, person responsible for Public Works. For major renovations, contact the Municipality to find out where you can dispose of these materials.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING CONTAINERS

We would like to remind residents that large garbage and recycling containers located on a number of non-municipalized streets are there for the use of residents who do not have door to door collection of garbage and recycling. Because they do not have rolling bins, the Municipality has installed large garbage and recycling bins for their use only. When residents who benefit from door to door collection use these containers, those with the right to use them cannot dispose of their waste since the containers are full.

Please be civil and respectful towards your fellow citizens and do not use these containers if they are not meant for you.

Notice to Sommet Bleu Development

To avoid the nuisance of wild animals getting into your garbage, all



household waste must be deposited inside and not next to the containers put at your disposal.

Please note that the garbage removal company will not pick up garbage which has been left next to the containers. If containers are full, we ask that you please wait until next collection day.

As for the recycling, you must fold or cut cardboard boxes before depositing them in the recycling bins to avoid filling the bins up too quickly. Thank you for your collaboration.

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR FALLEN LEAVE

Bags of leaves will not be picked up during the regular weekly



collection of household garbage.
The Municipality will organize a special collection the week of **October 29**th.
Bags of leaves should be placed by the side of the road in front of your residence. No reservation required.

DISTRIBUTION OF WOOD CHIPS

At certain times of the year, the Municipality has wood chips to distribute. If you



wish to receive some, please contact the person responsible for Public Works, Dany Laberge at 418-844-1218.

HHW COLLECTION (HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE)

The Municipality will offer a Hazardous Household Waste (HHW) recycling depot, free of charge, on **Sunday, SEPTEMBER 16th from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.** at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier). **You must bring your hazardous materials to the depot location.**

Here is a list of materials that can be recuperated:

PAINTS

Paints:

- sold by retail businesses (100 ml containers and larger)
- sold by wholesale businesses (170 L containers and larger intended for architectural use)
- primers and paints (latex, alkyd, enamel and other)
- metal or anti-rust paint
- aluminum paint
- dyes
- varnishes
- lacquers
- products or preparations for the treatment of wood (preservatives) or masonry (acrylic sealers for driveways)
- signalisation paints (those available in retail businesses)

Aerosol paints

ORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acetone, adhesives, aerosols, solid fire starter, rubbing alcohol, starter fluid, glue, wax, antifreeze, caulking, dye, plastic cement, solid fuel, fondue fuel, lock de-icer, degreasing agents, oil stain remover, paint thinner, petroleum distillate, ink, epoxy, gasoline, ethylene glycol, roofing tar, motor grease, heating and lamp oil, lubricant, methanol, petroleum, polish, Polyfilla, leather, suede or vinyl protector, liquid resin, silicone sealant, wallpaper remover, shoe dye, turpentine, toluene.

INORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acids, bases, oxidizing agents, batteries,

pesticides and insecticides

Fluorescent compact light bulbs (CFL)





If you are not sure if a product that you would like to dispose of is on the list, bring it in to the depot and the trained employees will help you.

<u>Each container must be intended for residential use only. All products must be in their original containers.</u> <u>For safety reasons, do not mix products.</u>

During this collection, you may also bring in your used oil, used oil filters and oil containers (**non commercial use only**).

This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only.

MESSAGE FROM THE SO

SHARING THE ROAD

The Sûreté du Québec would like to remind everyone of the importance of their behavior on the roads. Whether as a driver of a vehicle, a cyclist or a



pedestrian, everyone must respect the various regulations in force, both by the Criminal Code and the Highway Safety Code.

A few rules to follow as a pedestrian:

- always use the sidewalk on the roadside, if there is no sidewalk, walk on the side of the road facing traffic;
- cross at intersections and pedestrian crossings;
- comply with pedestrian traffic lights installed at intersections, if there are no pedestrian traffic lights, comply with vehicle traffic lights.

According to the Highway Safety Code, a pedestrian may not

- cross an intersection diagonally, unless a police officer, a crossing guard or other signage authorizes it;
- hitch a ride on a roadside or where passing is not allowed;
- travel on a highway or one of it's access roads.

A few rules to observe as a cyclist:

The Highway Safety Code forbids a cyclist, among others to travel:

- on highways or their access roads;
- against traffic unless signs authorize circulating against traffic for bicycles;
- on the sidewalk;
- with headphones;
- between two rows of moving vehicles.

It is also forbidden:

- to transport a passenger, unless a seat is provided for that purpose;
- to drink alcohol while circulating.

We remind drivers that they must respect the distance of one meter when passing a cyclist in a 50 km/h and less area and respect a distance of over 1,5 meters in a zone over 50 km/h. In a situation where it is impossible to safely pass a cyclist, remain behind until able to pass safely. Highway Safety Code, you may consult the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec's website.

MODIFICATION TO BY-LAWS

The Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Service, in partnership with the Municipality's Urbanism Service, have worked on the modification of by-laws number 175 and 184 concerning Fire prevention.

The amendment regulations complete the security requirements to ensure the safety of people on the territory of the Municipality. It requires the installation and maintenance of fire extinguishers for the areas referred to in section 4.5 of By-Law 213, the installation of a carbon monoxide alarm for homes with combustion appliances and this, to ensure and optimize the safety of people.

The adoption of these amending by-laws will allow the SGDVFSS to continue its mission in the territory, in all fairness for every citizen, by meeting the prevention commitments provided for in the MRC's Fire Safety Coverage Plan. .

The modification of these by-laws touches 100% of the Municipality's population.

Here are the main changes:

BY-LAW NUMBER 213 modifying By-Law number 175

ARTICLE 4.3 Fire risk control

The following activities are prohibited and considered as a nuisance:

The fact, for a homeowner, manager or occupant of a building, to interrupt a fire alarm signal and resetting the alarm system. Only an officer charged with the application of By-Law number 214 concerning alarm systems may proceed to such an operation.

ARTICLE 4.5 Portable extinguisher

Each housing unit of a residential building situated in the Sommet Bleu, Lac Blanc and Lac des Sources sectors, must be equipped with a Class ABC portable extinguisher of at least 5 lbs. Such an extinguisher must be maintained in good functioning order, be accessible and easily be located.

ARTICLE 4.6 Carbon Monoxide detector

It is forbidden to operate a combustion appliance in a building that does not have a carbon monoxide detector.

BY-LAW NUMBER 214 modifying By-Law number 184 CONCERNING ALARM SYSTEMS-RMH110

Fine for repeat offences

Fines vary between \$100 to \$200 for a first offence, in the case of an individual, and in the case of a repeat offence for a fifth false alarm, the fine is \$2000 for an individual and \$4000 for a business or organisation and each additional alarm.

MESSAGES FROM THE SAINT-GABRIEL-DE-VALCARTIER FIRE PREVENTION SERVICE

These last years, the electronic cigarette, a device equipped with a battery and a microprocessor, has gained popularity in Quebec. Some fire risks are related to its use.

If you do use such a device, the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Service offers some tips to put into practice to protect yourself from the fire risk it can cause.

Safety tips:

- * It is important not to overcharge the battery and follow the manufacturer's maintenance recommendations. Batteries that are over charged may explode and provoke a fire.
- * When you charge your electronic cigarette, it is recommended not to leave it without surveillance and to practice this activity during the day.
- * Avoid recharging the battery when you are sleeping.
- * If an electronic cigarette's battery is overcharged, the lithium it contains can overheat and flame up.
- * Use accessories furnished by the manufacturer (charger, USB cable, etc.).
- * Avoid using electronic cigarettes in the presence of oxygen cylinders (oxygenotherapy).
- * Do not transport an electronic cigarette in your pocket without a protective case. The battery could come into contact with metallic pieces and generate a spark. It is suggested to always transport it in its case.

Carbon monoxide poisoning

Carbon monoxide poisoning can be fatal therefore it is important to be aware of the inherent risks and to take appropriate preventive measures.

Carbon monoxide is the result of the incomplete combustion of a fossil fuel, which produces an odorless, colorless, tasteless, non-irritating and toxic gas. The latter can be deadly, even at low concentrations in the ambient air.

In new residential construction, the carbon monoxide alarm is mandatory if the dwelling is equipped with a fireplace whose doors are not perfectly sealed.

Safety tips:

- * Obtain a ULC-2034 certified carbon monoxide alarm.
- * Install in the area recommended by the manufacturer.
- * Test your carbon monoxide alarm once per month, using the test button.
- * Install your alarm inside the house and not the garage.
- * If your alarm goes off, immediately call 9-1-1 and mention that it is a carbon monoxide alarm.

What produces carbon monoxide?

Carbon monoxide is produced when a vehicle or device burns fuel such as gasoline, oil, natural gas, propane, kerosene, naphtha or wood. Many appliances in our homes can produce carbon monoxide: gas and oil furnaces and water heaters, solid fuel burning appliances, combustion engines, and so on.

What are the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning?

Carbon monoxide poisoning symptoms are very similar to those of gastroenteritis: headache, nausea, fatigue, dizziness.

What should I do if my carbon monoxide alarm is activated?

Call 9-1-1 and observe the health condition of all your family members (dizziness, nausea, headache, etc.). If they have any or all of these symptoms, it is likely to be carbon monoxide poisoning. Prolonged intoxication with high concentration can be fatal. In Quebec, there are approximately 15 deaths annually attributable to this type of intoxication.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK FROM OCTOBER 7 TO 13, 2018

Fire prevention week will be from October 7-13, 2018 and the this year's theme is: PRENVENTION IS GOOD—IT HAPPENS IN THE

GOOD HABITS TO DEVELOP:

To avoid a kitchen fire, fire prevention technicians suggest the adoption of the following habits:

- Use a timer;
- Use the proper tools and equipment for cooking (ex oven mitt);
- Keep the cooking surface clear at all times;
- Keep pot covers handy;
- Handle hot foods or boiling liquids with care;;
- Turn pot handles so that they don't hang

over the stove top;

- Regularly clean cooking appliances and stove hood;
- Wear safe clothing when using a stove (careful of loose clothing, flammable materials);
- Use a fryer equipped with a thermostat;;
- Let a fondue burner cool before refilling it with fuel:

Use a barbecue in a secure manner, following the manufacturer's instructions. Smoke and fire spread quickly. Once a fire is set, it is too late to plan an escape route. It is imperative that a home has functional smoke alarms and a planned evacuation route with all occupants before a fire happens.





INVASIVE SPECIES

The Corporation du bassin de la Jacques-Cartier reminds us that with the arrival of the warm weather also brings the growth of certain invasive exotic species of plant that can be found on the territory of the JacquesCartier and near rivers.

For security and for conservation of ecological integrity, the CBJC would like residents to be careful near these invasive exotic species on their properties, particularly regarding 2 species: Japanese Knotwood, which by its density, deprives the biological diversity of the ecosystem, and Giant Hogweed, which causes skin lesions that resemble burns.
