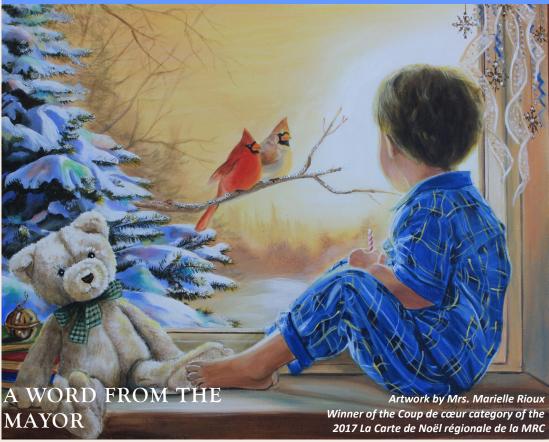

During the evening the Mayor and municipal council thanked to the municipal employees and above all, the many volunteers who proudly work together throughout the year to enhance the services of our beautiful Municipality so that it truly reflects the image of its citizens. ## CIVIC NUMBERS AND EMERGENCIES

The Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Services would like remind you of the importance of identifying your buildings. **The civic number is of paramount importance during an emergency intervention.** 

For example, when a person is a victim of heart failure, this person must be defibrillated as soon as possible. It should be noted that between the moment of heart failure and the moment when defibrillation is applied, the survival rate of victims diminishes by 7% to 10% every minute that passes and 12 minutes after heart failure, the victims' survival rate drops to between 2% and 5%. Therefore, every second counts. If Emergency services teams must search for a civic number because it isn't well situated, too small or if the number is incomplete or lit badly, this can make a difference between life and death.

The Municipality is concerned about every citizen's security and well-being. We would like to remind you that a By-law exists to this effect. By-law number 150 stipulates in article 3.8 « Any major use must be identified by a distinct civic number in Arabic numeral, or in letter, readable horizontally, visible from the street at all times. »

We count on your collaboration in order to help us locate you as rapidly as possible during an emergency. This simple gesture could save a life.

## BLUE RECYCLING BINS-WHAT'S ACCEPTED, WHAT'S NOT

Our waste removal contractor for recycling materials would like to remind you of the following:

## Materials accepted

Paper and cardboard

- All clean paper and cardboard products;
- Containers of cream, milk and juice (Tetra Pak).

#### **Plastics**

- Unsoiled containers and bottles displaying this symbol;
- Rinsed out yogurt containers, without the aluminum lid;
- Food containers and unsoiled Styrofoam displaying this symbol (including coffee cups, meat trays, plates and plastic utensils);
- Used oil and antifreeze containers (including caps or covers);

- Stretch plastic wrap (Saran Wrap<sup>™</sup>)
- Clean plastic bags (except for Oxo-biodegradable bags with the mention EPI).

### Metals

- Clean tin cans:
- Returnable aluminium can;
- Unsoiled aluminum plates and paper;
- Empty paint containers, dry, without covers;
- Christmas lights;
- Extension cords.

## Glass

• Rinsed out containers, bottles and jars.

### Material not accepted

- Clothing;
- Batteries;
- Long hose, ropes or wires;

- Indoor or garden furniture;
- Toys;
- Propane tanks;
- Chemical products;
- Pool items and products;
- Syringes\*.

## ATTENTION!

## **Syringes**

Syringes are strictly prohibited in the recycling bin, even if they are placed in a container provided for this purpose, because they can hinder the safety and health of workers in the sorting center. **Publisac:** 

The paper and cardboard must be removed from the plastic bag. **Containers**:

Containers must be rinsed out in order to preserve the health of workers in the sorting center and avoid contamination of recyclable materials.

## MUNICIPAL SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

All local roads within the Municipality (except 5th Avenue and Boulevard Valcartier) are treated as follows:

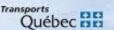

## POSITIONING OF ROLLING BINS

The positioning of rolling bins on the day of garbage /recycling collection often poses a problem for snow removal contractors affecting their ability to properly carry out their task.

Here are a few recommendations that should help facilitate garbage and recycling collection: We remind you that bins should be placed in your driveway, not on the shoulder of the road and

should be at a distance of 1 meter from the public road.

Leave a distance of 2 feet (0,6 meters) between bins and any other objects (mailboxes, trees, winter shelters, fences, markers for snow removal) to facilitate the use of the truck's mechanical arm.

You can place your bins at the end of your driveway the night before collection or before 7:00

a.m. the morning of.
Never

place any materials on bin covers.

Bin wheels and handles should be facing the residence. You must put away your bins once the collection has been completed. Thank you for your cooperation.



## NON-HOUSEHOLD WASTE COLLECTION (BULK WASTE)

During the winter season, collection of bulk waste is held once monthly, therefore on **December 7<sup>th</sup>**, **January 11<sup>th</sup>**, **February 1<sup>st</sup> and March 1<sup>st</sup>**. We would like to remind you that you must call the Municipality **418 844-1218** to register for this service. ## MESSAGES DU SERVICE DE SÉCURITÉ INCENDIE

## Ashes - Fireplace / Chimney

When cleaning your chimney, the ashes must be placed in a metal container and covered with a metal lid.

The use of a plastic container or bag is forbidden and very dangerous. Ashes can remain hot for up to 72 hours after a fire goes out.

The metal container filled with ashes must never be stored near a combustible surface.

### Cleaning of the chimney

If your heating system, whether it is a main system or a backup system, has a chimney, you are advised to have it cleaned at least once a year and to clean the pipes regularly, as the accumulation of creosote is responsible for many fires. Routine cleaning of your chimney in early fall is a good habit to get into.

Creosote is a flammable residue that settles on the walls of the chimney pipe. You can limit the accumulation of this residue by burning only dry wood. Do not burn garbage that is plastic, painted or treated wood or wood which contains glue such as plywood or chipboard. Their combustion releases toxic chemicals that contribute to the accumulation of creosote.

If your wood burning stove or fireplace (appliance) is used regularly, it would be wise to do another cleaning in the months of January or February.

An accumulation of 3 mm of creosote on the walls of a chimney pipe is a definite precursor to a chimney fire.

## Did you know?

- You should have your chimney cleaned at least once a year by a specialist.
- An accumulation of 3 mm of creosote is enough to cause a fire.
- Ashes can stay warm for up to 5 days; keep them in a covered metal container, far from the house!

#### Carbon monoxide alarm

It is impossible to notice the presence of this odorless and colorless gas unless you are equipped with a carbon monoxide alarm.

It is best to install an alarm on each floor of your home and in the basement if necessary (presence of a source of carbon monoxide), as well as near the door giving access to the garage.

It should be noted that carbon monoxide also spreads in the air. The alarm can be installed at the top as well as at the bottommost part of a room.

## Frequently Asked Questions -

## Where does carbon monoxide come from?

Carbon monoxide comes from combustion from a fireplace, a gas fireplace or a furnace. For example, vehicles running in garages attached to residences produce a lot of carbon monoxide.

## Why is this gas so dangerous?

Carbon monoxide takes the place of oxygen in the blood. It can take days, if not months, to completely leave our system. The best way to rebalance everything is to give a significant supply of oxygen.

## What are the dangers in our households?

As homes are becoming more airtight, it becomes difficult to get rid of this gas, especially during the winter. A short exposure to gas is not necessarily dangerous. However, the longer the exposure, the greater the health risks.

## Safety tips over the holiday season - If you choose to put up a natural

- Choose one that appears the least dry as much as possible;
- Water the tree daily;

**Christmas tree:** 

- Make sure the tree is securely fastened in a solid support;
- Do not place the tree in a high traffic



area, doorway, or near a heating system vent, radiator, stove, fireplace, or lighted candles.

## **Christmas decorations and lighting**

Decorations must not block or obstruct access to emergency exits of the building nor hinder an emergency evacuation. In addition, some decorative elements are often flammable and can cause fires.

Use approved lighting from a recognized organization (ACNOR, ULC or UL) to decorate your home.

- For the exterior, use lights that are specifically made for the outdoors.
- For indoors, only indoor lighting should be used.
- Do not overload power outlets. Use more than one outlet if the wattage of all lights exceeds the capacity of the outlet.
- Turn off all light decorations before going to bed or leaving home.
- Closely verify electrical wires and extension cords. Discard the wires that are damaged, those with loose wiring, or loose connections.
- Discard the complete light set if any socket is broken or damaged.
   Do not place any electrical wires in the doorways and under carpets.

### **Candles**

- Never leave candles that have been lit. unattended.
- Make sure candles are out of reach of children, pets, trees, decorations or wrapping paper.
- If necessary, cut the wick of the candle to prevent the flame from getting too high and use solid candlesticks that do not tilt easily.

## MESSAGE FROM THE SÛRETÉ DU QUÉBEC

#### WINTER STORMS AND EXTREME COLD

In winter, weather events may be of surprising intensity or duration. Abundant snowfall or freezing rain lasting several days, heavy blizzards and severe wind chill pose risks to individuals and property, and may cause interruptions to essential services or activities in the community.

## There are certain steps you can take to reduce hazards during a winter storm:

- Take precautions before winter arrives
- Prepare for a winter storm or extreme cold warnings
- Take precautions during a winter storm or extreme cold
- Watch for frostbite or symptoms of hypothermia
- Exercise caution when driving in a winter storm
- Remove snow from your roof
- Evacuate your home
- Return to your home when authorized to do so

#### PREPARE FOR A WINTER STORM OR EXTREME COLD WARNINGS

#### If a winter storm or extreme cold is forecasted:

- Make sure you have sufficient food and water, as well as enough fuel.
- Have adequate supplies of prescription drugs on hand.
- Take weather warnings into account when planning activities.
- Remove snow from your roof, or have it removed, if necessary.

## TAKE PRECAUTIONS DURING A WINTER STORM OR EXTREME COLD Follow certain safety rules:

- Avoid all unnecessary travel and postpone non-essential appointments.
- Take measures to protect yourself from the harmful effects of extreme cold.
- Call people at risk among your family and friends to ensure their wellbeing.
- Use backup heating systems according to the manufacturers' instructions.
- Use wood heating carefully and constantly monitor the fireplace and stoves.
- Take precautions to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Make sure that the chimney outlet is not blocked by accumulated snow
- Alert your municipality to any situation that requires the intervention of municipal services (burst water main, branches in the road, etc.).
- Listen to the media for instructions from authorities and for information about service interruptions or special measures that concern you.

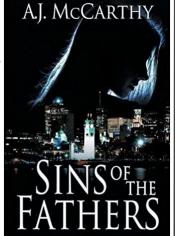
