MUNICIPAL SNOW REMOVAL **POLICY**

All local roads within the Municipality (except 5th Avenue and Boulevard Valcartier) are treated as follows:

The roads are cleared so as to maintain snow packed driving lanes treated with an abrasive (sand) at critical areas only.

Critical areas are sectors requiring special attention such as curbs. hills. intersections, bridges or any other section of road which might present special conditions.





CIVIL SECURITY—DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

You are the first person responsible for your own safety!

In an emergency situation or disaster, its up to you to take the first steps to assure your own safety, that of your family and the safeguard your property.

What you can do?

- Find out from your municipality or the Internet about the risk of disaster in your community and the measures to take to protect yourself
- ✓ Prepare an emergency family plan.
- Have an emergency kit at home at all times containing the essential items that will help you survive for the first 3 days of an emergency and that you can take with you in the event of an evacuation.
- ✓ Insure your assets properly.

Did you know that... Over 5,300 principal residences, located in 291 municipalities in 15 of Québec's 17 administrative regions, were flooded during the spring 2017 floods? More than 4000 people were evacuated from their homes.



In 2018, the Municipality revised its procedures for the collection of bulk household waste. This service is offered so that residents can rid themselves of objects not accepted in the regular garbage and recycling services. As of January 1st, 2019, the collection will be offered a maximum of 4 times per year per household and we will not pick up ANY construction/renovation materials. During the winter season, the bulk waste collection is held once per month, therefore on December 6th, January 10th, February 7th and March 7th. We remind you that you must call 418 844-1218 to schedule this service or register on-line on the Municipality's website, under the «On-line request» section. SEPTIC INSTALLATIONS-TIPS

The Municipality provides the service to empty all septic tanks every two (2) years for residential and commercial septic tanks and every four (4) years for seasonal residences. The next service will be in 2019.

Until next summer the contractor hired for our municipality is SANI-CHARLEVOIX. They can be reached at 1-418-639-2731.

The cost to empty a septic tank outside of the regular operating period negotiated in their contract is \$175.00 for a regular emptying.

Do you want to maximize the life of your septic system?

If your tank is fitted with a pre-filter, please make sure it is cleaned once a year. It is the responsibility of the owner to do so.

The primary treatment tank is used to clarify the wastewater by the decantation of suspended solids and the retention of floating material.

The biological activity (bacterial flora) present in the tank must be protected in order to avoid short term clogging of the system. In order to do so, it is essential to implement the following recommendations:

- Do not use additives in your tank.
- Use biodegradable toilet paper.
- Use a detergent with no phosphates.
- Use bleach in reasonable quantities.

Never throw the following in your toilet or sink: facial tissue (Kleenex), cotton swabs (Q-tips), cigarette butts, sanitary napkins, wipes, condoms, oils, grease and paint.

ASSESSMENT ROLL - FIRST YEAR

IS HEREBY GIVEN by the undersigned, Director General / Secretary-Treasurer of the said Municipality:

THAT the three-year assessment roll for the Municipality for the years 2019, 2020, 2021 was deposited;

THAT those interested may consult the said roll at the Municipal Office located at 1743, boulevard Valcartier, Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier, from Monday to Friday, from 8:30 am to noon and from 1:00 to 4:30 pm;

THAT all complaints regarding an inscription on the assessment roll must be filed following the procedure below:

Administrative Revision:

A request for revision must be filed before May 1st, 2019 using the prescribed form (otherwise the request will be rejected) and submitted to the municipal organisation responsible for the evaluation (M.R.C. de la Jacques-Cartier, 60, rue Saint-Patrick, Shannon) accompanied by the applicable fees. The above mentioned form is available at the Municipal Office,

Revision by the Quebec Administrative Tribunal:

In the case where there is no agreement between the evaluator and the plaintiff (administrative revision), the plaintiff may file a complaint with the Quebec Administrative Tribunal (T.A.Q.) within a delay of thirty (30) days following the date on which the evaluator's response was sent, or if the evaluator neglects to produce a response, within a delay of thirty (30) days following the due date prescribed by Law.

All complaints must be made using the prescribed form and filed at the offices of the Quebec Administrative Tribunal (T.A.Q.) or at any office of the Quebec Court accompanied by all applicable fees.

MESSAGE FROM FIRE SAFETY SERVICES

Here are a few fire prevention tips for your holiday planning. For optimal safety, please pay special attention to By-law no. 213 regarding fire prevention:

According to article 4.6 'No one may operate a combustion apparatus in a building not equipped with a carbon monoxide detector. This means of fire detection is now mandatory.'

CHRISTMAS TREES

- Artificial trees are recommended over natural trees
- Choose a freshly-cut tree with green needles that cannot easily be removed.
- Cut the trunk on an angle, even for a tree purchased pre-cut, as this will help it to absorb water
- Place the tree in a container and always keep it full of water. A tree that has been allowed to dry out can combust quickly and easily.
- Install the tree at least 1 meter away from all heat sources, such as a heater or fireplace.
- Place the tree away from exits or hallways.
- Recycle the tree or dispose of it according to municipal by-law when the holidays are over or when it becomes too dry. Do not store it indoors, in a garage or near the house. Do not burn it in your fireplace or wood stove.
- Always disconnect the lights before leaving the house or going to bed.

DECORATIVE LIGHTS

- Use decorative lights approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or ULC
- Make sure lights are in good working order. Do not install damaged, frayed or dried out strings of lights.
- Verify the manufacturer's instructions when installing decorative lights. Often, no more than 3 strings of lights may be connected end-to-end.
- Do not pull on the cable to

- disconnect the lights. This may cause damage and start a fire. Hold the plug firmly.
- Disconnect the lights before leaving the house or going to bed or use a timer.
- Do not allow children to change the lightbulbs or plug in the lights.
- Do not use decoration intended for outdoors use indoors.
- Always make sure that lights are in good condition: winter conditions can cause damage.
- Hang lights with insulated tape.
 Do not use nails or tacks.
- Keep connectors out of metal gutters and away from the ground.
- Remove your outdoor garlands and lights after the holidays are over to prevent damage.

CANDLES

- Never decorate your tree with candles.
- Keep candles away from curtains or any flammable object and never leave them unattended.
- Make sure that candle holders are stable and fire resistant.
- Monitor children and animals around candles.

OTHER DECORATIONS AND POSSIBLE DANGERS

- Never decorate your fireplace mantle with natural branches, such as balsam, pine or spruce. They dry quickly and may catch fire.
- Avoid decorations made of crepe paper as they are highly flammable
- Always use extension cords that are approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or ULC.
- Avoid rolling up cords that are too long to avoid the risk of overheating or cause an electric arc.
 - Never leave extension cords in a high traffic area. Instead, install your tree and other electric

- decorations near an outlet.
- Never hide an extension cord under a carpet or rug. The weight and friction can increase the risk of fire.
- Never leave an extension cord in a door as its insulation may be damaged if the door closes on it.
- Never overload an electric outlet or extension cord.
- Never connect extension cords end-to-end. Use only one at a time.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Provide batteries when giving a gift that requires one so no one is tempted to remove the smoke alarm batteries.
- Never burn gift wrap in the fireplace or wood stove.
- Keep exits clear of any obstacles, indoors and outdoors and shovel the walkways.
 - Make sure that smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are in working order. An alarm that works at all times can save lives and must be replaced as indicated inside its casing. If no date is indicated, if the detector is damaged, or if they no longer emit a signal after changing the batteries, it must be replaced. It is important to install, when necessary, a carbon monoxide detector in order to protect your life as well as your loved ones. Smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are not a choice, they are an obligation!




