# 2019 MUNICIPAL PROGRAM FOR THE EMPTYING OF SEPTIC TANKS

#### Summer 2019

#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION:**

- Take good note of the schedule (The Indispensable Bulletin, mailings, website);
- To avoid charges, make sure that the edges of covers are cleared in depth as well as the handles on each side;
- Due to the complexity of the schedule/operation, **no accommodation is possible**. If necessary, request the assistance of a neighbour or other person;
- The operator can refuse to offer the service if covers are not cleared properly and in depth or if there are obstructions of any kind. Fees are charged for a 2<sup>nd</sup> visit when caused by neglect to follow procedures.

The Municipality is responsible for the emptying of septic tanks on its territory. Note that this service is offered by the Municipality without additional costs under certain conditions. In conformity with the current provincial By-Law on the matter (Q-2, r.22), a septic tank used year-round must be emptied every 2 years and every 4 years for a septic tank used on a seasonal basis.

A regular septic waste collection, combined with a quality construction of your septic system and proper maintenance, will allow it to be used to its full potential, maximize its useful life and protect your investment. #### **COMPOSTING CONFERENCE**

Would you like to reduce the quantity of organic materials that you throw away?

You would like to change your habits, to make your own compost in order to embellish your flower boxes, have a greener lawn, spruce up your garden and improve the quality of the soil; to be part of the people who encourage local recycling of organic materials; to help the environment?

The Municipality has organized a conference on domestic composting and its particularities. The speaker, Ms. Lili Michaud, is an agronomist and author. She obtained a bachelor's degree in bio-economics from Laval University. She is a specialist in urban ecological practices and has expertise in topics such as: ecological cultivation of vegetables and herbs, home composting, ecological management of water in the garden and many others.

This <u>free</u> conference will be offered in French only. However, someone will be on-site to answer questions in English. Directions on how to make a wood composter will be made available. We will also offer the possibility of buying a pre-fabricated composter. The Municipality will subsidize 50% of the cost (limited to one composter per address).

#### **MAY 26 HHW COLLECTION**

The Municipality will offer a Hazardous Household Waste (HHW) recycling depot, free of charge, on **Sunday, May 26**<sup>th</sup> from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier).

You must bring your dangerous materials to the depot location.

#### Here is a list of materials that can be recuperated:

#### **PAINTS**

#### Paints:

- sold by retail businesses (100 ml containers and larger)
- sold by wholesale businesses (170 L containers and larger intended for architectural use)
- primers and paints (latex, alkyd, enamel and other)
- metal or anti-rust paint, staine
- aluminum paint
- dyes
- varnishes
- lacquers
- products or preparations for the treatment of wood (preservatives) or masonry (acrylic sealers for driveways)
- signalisation paints (those available in retail businesses)

Aerosol paints

#### **ORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE**

Acetone, adhesives, aerosols, solid fire starter, rubbing alcohol, starter fluid, glue, wax, antifreeze, caulking, dye, plastic cement, solid fuel, fondue fuel, lock de-icer, degreasing agents, oil stain remover, paint thinner, petroleum distillate, ink, epoxy, gasoline, ethylene glycol, roofing tar, motor grease, heating and lamp oil, lubricant, methanol, petroleum, polish, Polyfilla, leather, suede or vinyl protector, liquid resin, silicone sealant, wallpaper remover, shoe dye, turpentine, toluene.

### INORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

If you are not sure if a product that you would like to dispose of is on the list,

This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only.

#### **MUNICIPAL TAXES**

We would like to remind you that the second instalment for 2019 municipal taxes is due on July 1<sup>st</sup>. The privilege to pay in three instalments cannot be granted unless each instalment is paid in full by the due date. Interest and penalties will apply to the account's totality for all late payments.

#### **ERRATUM**

Please take note that a technical error occurred while updating the municipal data base for the deposit of the new 2019-2020-2021 triennial roll regarding property area. You will notice on your tax bill that a decimal point was moved one position to the right. This error in no way affects neither your evaluation nor the calculation of your municipal taxes. The necessary corrections were made and will be correct on all future correspondence from the Municipality. We apologize for this confusion.

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF SAPLINGS - MAY 26**

This year again, the Ministry of Forests, Wildlife and Parks (MFFP) will be organizing, in collaboration with the Association forestière des deux rives (AF2R), the Mois de l'arbre et des forêts, which will be held through the month of May 2019.

The Municipality will distribute young tree saplings to every resident who brings in hazardous household waste on Sunday, May 26th to raise awareness of the importance and respect of trees and forests. The saplings are offered free of charge by the Ministry and their distribution is coordinated by the AF2R.

#### REUSABLE DIAPER PROGRAM

The Municipality is now offering a reusable diaper subsidy through a waste reduction program to reimburse the purchase of a set of cloth diapers up to a maximum of \$100.

This program is intended for parents of infants younger than one

vear



residing in Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier. The subsidy program will end upon the decision of the municipal council.

The form as well as terms and conditions are available at the municipal office, and on the municipal website and Facebook pages.

#### **SUMMER JOB FOR STUDENTS**

#### PUBLIC WORKS:

Maintenance of municipal property and varied manual work. You must have a valid driver's licence to apply for this job.

#### Admissibility requirements:

- 5 days per week, starting June 3<sup>rd</sup>;
- \* Aged 16 years or over;
- You must be a student returning to school in the fall of 2019.

Priority will be given to applicants residing in Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier.

#### **FALLEN LEAVES PICKUP**

<u>Bags of leaves</u> are not accepted during the weekly pickup of household garbage. There will be a special collection the week of <u>May 27<sup>h</sup></u>. Bags of leaves should be placed by the side of the road in front of your residence.

#### **BULK PICKUP**

The weekly collection of non-household waste (bulk waste) is held every Tuesday. This service functions on a <u>call-in basis only, please do not deposit non-household waste in front of large garbage containers or community mailboxes</u>. You must call the <u>Municipality at 418 844-1218 or register on our website</u> to schedule this service and give us an itemized list of materials to be collected. It is important that the materials be set out in an organized manner (ex: carpets must be rolled and tied, metal must be sorted, wire must be rolled and tied, etc.)

#### Objects that qualify for bulk pick up:

\*Used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. However, the tires must be separated from the rims. \*Vegetable oils used for cooking in their original containers or in a clear well identified plastic container.

#### Objects that DO NOT qualify for bulk pick up:

\*Vehicle carcasses or frames \*Tree and brush debris \*Household garbage \*Leaves and \*Recyclable materials.

Please note that renovation materials are no longer accepted in the bulk pickup and that the bulk pickup service is now limited to 4 times per year per residence.

#### **DOG OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES**

Although your dog may be your best friend, some representatives of the canine breed can make the neighbors growl. If you own a dog, assume your responsibilities:



- Respect the provisions in the municipal Bylaw concerning dogs
- Respect your neighborhood by adopting responsible behavior towards your dog and its needs (Pick up and throw out their droppings!)
- Do not let your dog bark unnecessarily
- Keep your dog tied or on a leash at all times

#### **BIOLOGICAL CONTROL OF BITING INSECTS**

The Municipality awarded the contract for the biological control of biting insects for the summer season 2019 to the firm Conseillers Forestiers Roy Inc. The prospecting activities of the breeding sites as well as the spreading operations begin early in the spring and continue until the end of August.

Teams of technicians will travel throughout the Municipality and its surroundings several times over the summer to ensure a reduction of the nuisance.

It is important to remember that the result expected from these operations is a reduction of about 80% and not an eradication of biting insects.

The Biting Insect Control Program solicits citizen collaboration to allow access to areas of high production of mosquitoes and blackflies, to the teams of technicians.

For the sole purpose of contributing to the efficiency of operations, we present certain behaviors to adopt, which will limit the growth of mosquitoes:

 Unused pools must be covered or in operation.

- Boats or water crafts (boats, canoes, kayaks) must be emptied and turned upside down
- Various containers (tires, buckets, wheelbarrows) must be emptied and turned upside down
- Water basins and birdbaths must be maintained in order to eliminate stagnant water
- Ensure a continuous flow of the water in gutters and ditches
- Fill ruts and holes (with sand, gravel, dirt) in order to prevent accumulation of stagnant water

Water accumulated at these sites could generate several hundred mosquitoes each week.

The Municipality is looking for volunteers to conduct "nuisance tests" for the biological control of

mosquitoes and black flies

The effectiveness of the control program is measured by "nuisance tests" which are performed by the staff of *Conseillers* forestiers Roy in the presence of an independent witness.

Tests are done three times a week and duration of testing process is approximately 15 to 30 minutes. If you are interested in participating, please let us know

**REMINDER - WINTER SHELTERS** 

As of <u>April 30<sup>th</sup></u>, all shelters considered as temporary, such as garages (mobile wood panels or canvas) and snow fences must be dismantled. According to the established by-law, these structures are authorized from October 1<sup>st</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>.

Please respect your neighborhood and comply with this regulation under penalty of law. (\$200 minimum per day for a continuing offense).

#### **WATERMAIN ENTRY VALVE**

Each residence serviced by the aqueduct network is equipped with a water main entry valve which connects to the water supply. The water main entry valve to the aqueduct network which sticks out of the ground at the front of your property, commonly called "bottle" is buried underground, generally in front of the residence, usually at the limit of the property between the municipal and the owner's properties. It is therefore very important that this entry valve be visible and

accessible at all times.


None other than a municipal employee is authorized to handle this water hook up.



## COLLECTIVE TREATMENT TO ERADICATE AMBROSIA

In 2019, the Municipality will again participate in a treatment program to eradicate ragweed.

The common goal is to **permanently eliminate** this highly allergenic plant.



#### Here's how you can actively participate:

- Uproot any ragweed plants on your property.
- Locate the infested zones in your neighbourhood.
- Make your neighbours aware of the hazards posed by this plant.

This annual collective **program** aims to **significantly reduce** pollen levels and this, in the best interest of the local population.

The socioeconomic impact related to respiratory allergies amounts to 250 million dollars annually.

#### **FIRE SAFETY SERVICE**

#### FIRE PREVENTION VISITS

The Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Fire Safety Service would like to remind our citizens that the 2019 Residential Fire Prevention Program will begin in May. Identified, uniformed firefighters will carry out inspections of the homes on our territory.

They have been mandated by the Fire Safety Service to make recommendations regarding the conformity with fire safety regulation of your residence.

During their visits, the firefighters will verify the installation and maintenance of your smoke detectors. Please be advised that smoke detectors must be installed on each floor of your home, including the basement. The best places to install them are in hallways, near bedrooms, insuring that there are no obstacles impeding efficient air circulation.

Whether they are electric or battery powered, smoke detectors must be replaced every 10 years following the manufacturer's instructions (never exceed the suggested expiry date). Landlords must provide a smoke detector to their tenants, but the tenants are responsible for changing the batteries. Always change your batteries when the time changes.


#### MUNICIPAL DAY CAMP COMPLIANCE-2019


