

A WORD FROM THE MAYOR

Our Spring was quite slow but once July arrived, we certainly made up for lost time. I hope everyone was able to take advantage of the beautiful weather and are ready for some pleasant autumn days.

am proud of our Municipality for being chosen the setting for the television series entitled «Barkskins». This major production will be produced by Fox TV and will be broadcast on the National Geographic Channel in 172 countries and 43 languages. It is based on a novel by awardwinning author Annie Proulx. The storyline recounts the arrival of the first settlers to Nouvelle France in 1690. Wanting the production to be as authentic as possible, the creators looked at several sites across the province before settling on our Municipality. They were looking for virgin territory with no signs of modern civilisation with a 360-degree camera view.

The municipal council granted a conditional usage permit with conditions after a public consultation meeting. Work began the following day transforming the site into a 17th century village with 17 structures in

all. The Quality of the work and attention to details as been very impressive. The first nine episodes are scheduled to air somewhere in January or February. Stay tuned for more information.

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome our new municipal inspector to our team. Mr. Stacy Gagné (see picture at left), a resident of our Municipality, began working in June. Wishing him all the best in his future duties. Enjoy the rest of summer and always remember to be safe.

We remind you that the third and final payment is due on September 1st, 2019, after which, interest fees will apply.


Payment methods:



JAPANESE KNOTWEED

This plant, while attractive, is on the charts as one of the 100 most invasive species on the planet According to the World Conservation Union. It prevents other plants from growing, weakens biodiversity and causes damage to infrastructures. Near waterways, it limits access to water, increases risks of flooding and increases erosion risks.

How to recognize Japanese knotweed

A rapidly growing perennial, knotweed can reach heights of 2 to 3 m during the summer. It is sometimes called Japanese bamboo because it has a hollow stalk like bamboo. In July and August, it produces many small white flowers, arranged in clusters at the base of the leaves.


It spreads rapidly due to its rhizomes, which can burrow up to 2 meters into the ground and up to 7 meters around the plant! It prevents other plants from growing nearby by secreting a phytotoxin into the soil.

It reproduces from tiny fragments of stems or rhizomes that can remain dormant in the soil for 10 years.

How to reduce its proliferation?

♦ Avoid cultivating it.

- Avoid mowing it, since mowing residues will promote its dispersion.
- ♦ If it is already growing in your garden, eliminate it as soon as possible. Pull up the young shoots by hand by gently pulling the seedling or digging it out. If it is late in the season, but the stem doesn't reach I meter,



♦ If it has largely developed, weaken it by cutting it down and pulling it out several times during the summer (approximately 2 to 3 times, from June to August) for several years in a row. Dispose of these in sealed plastic bags.

Japanese knotweed must not be composted or thrown out in nature. It must be disposed of in sturdy plastic bags and thrown out in **the trash**.

EMERALD ASH BORER

The emerald ash borer is an extremely destructive invasive beetle that attacks and kills all species of ash trees, but not mountain ash trees, which are not ash trees even though their English name mountain ash may suggest otherwise. The emerald ash borer has already killed millions of ash trees in North America.

To prevent the spread of Emerald Ash Borer, the CFIA has placed restrictions on the movement of ash logs and firewood outside regulated areas.

Report any new pest detection outside regulated areas at any CFIA office.

CHANGEMENTS D'ADRESSE 5° AVENUE

My change of address is a question of security!

The goal of this major project is to ensure the safety of our citizens by orienting our territory in a more consistent and logical manner that will streamline the locating of addresses. The municipal council has been studying this topic in order to minimize its impacts and ensure the best transition possible between the old and the new property addresses. It goes without saying that the safety of our population is the main concern of council and this project aims to facilitate the work of emergency services (first responders, fire services, ambulance, police, home-care services, etc.). Early this fall, all residents of 5th Avenue will receive their change of address kits. The change of addresses will come into effect on December 16th, 2019. Canada Post will continue to forward mail addressed to the previous address for one year, free of charge. Addresses on Boulevard Valcartier will be modified in the fall of 2020. WINTER SHELTERS

Winter shelters for either vehicles or for pedestrians at the entrance of a building, as well as snow fences and other winter protection are



authorized in all zones from October 1st to April 30th the following year.

BULK PICKUP

The collection of non-household waste (dry materials) is held weekly until the end of November. Starting the first week of December and, for the winter season (December, January and February), the collection will take place the first Thursday of each month. This service functions on a call-in basis only. Please do not deposit nonhousehold waste in front of containers or community mailboxes. You must call the Municipality at 418 844-1218 to request this service and provide an itemized list of materials to be picked up or register for the collection on our Website.

Dry waste materials include:

*Used tires (non-commercial use only) and rims. However, the tires must be separated from the rims. *Vegetable oils used for cooking in their original containers or in a clear well identified plastic container.

Objects that DO NOT qualify for bulk pick up:

*Renovation materials *Vehicle carcasses or frames *Tree and brush debris *Household garbage *Leaves and *Recyclable materials.

Please note that bulk pickup service is limited to 4 times per year per residence.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING CONTAINERS

We would like to remind residents that large garbage and recycling containers located on a number of non-municipalized streets are there for the use of residents who do not have door to door collection of garbage and recycling. Because they do not have rolling bins, the Municipality has installed large garbage and recycling bins for their use only. When residents who benefit from door to door collection use these containers, those with the right to use them cannot dispose of their waste since the containers are full.

Please be civil and respectful towards your fellow citizens and do not use these containers if they are not meant for you.

Notice to Sommet Bleu Development

To avoid the nuisance of wild animals getting into your garbage, all household



waste must be deposited inside and not next to the containers put at your disposal.

Please note that the garbage removal company will not pick up garbage which has been left next to the containers. If containers are full, we ask that you please wait until next collection day.

As for the recycling, you must fold or cut cardboard boxes before depositing them in the recycling bins to avoid filling the bins up too quickly. Thank you for your collaboration.

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR FALLEN LEAVES

Bags of leaves will not be picked up

during the regular weekly collection of household garbage.

The Municipality will organize a special collection the week of **November** $4t^{th}$. Bags of leaves should be placed by the side of the road in front of your residence. No reservation required.

DISTRIBUTION OF WOOD CHIPS

At certain times of the year, the Municipality has wood chips to distribute. If you



wish to receive some, please contact the person responsible for Public Works, Dany Laberge at 418-844-1218.

HHW COLLECTION (HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE)

The Municipality will offer a Hazardous Household Waste (HHW) recycling depot, free of charge, on Sunday, SEPTEMBER 15th from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the municipal garage parking lot (1745 Boulevard Valcartier). You must bring your hazardous materials to the depot location.

Here is a list of materials that can be recuperated:

PAINTS

Paints:

- sold by retail businesses (100 ml containers and larger)
- sold by wholesale businesses (170 L containers and larger intended for architectural use)
- primers and paints (latex, alkyd, enamel and other)
- metal or anti-rust paint
- aluminum paint
- dyes
- varnishes
- lacquers
- products or preparations for the treatment of wood (preservatives) or masonry (acrylic sealers for driveways)
- signalisation paints (those available in retail businesses)

Aerosol paints

ORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acetone, adhesives, aerosols, solid fire starter, alcohol, starter fluid, glue, wax, rubbing antifreeze, caulking, dye, plastic cement, solid fuel, fondue fuel, lock de-icer, degreasing agents, oil stain remover, paint thinner, petroleum distillate, ink, epoxy, gasoline, ethylene glycol, roofing tar, motor grease, heating and lamp oil, lubricant, methanol, petroleum, polish, Polyfilla, leather, suede or vinyl protector, liquid resin, silicone sealant, wallpaper remover, shoe dye, turpentine, toluene.

INORGANIC HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Acids, bases, oxidizing agents, batteries, pesticides and insecticides

Fluorescent compact light bulbs (CFL)





If you are not sure if a product that you would like to dispose of is on the list, bring it in to the depot and the trained employees will help you.

Each container must be intended for residential use only. All products must be in their original containers. For safety reasons, do not mix products.

During this collection, you may also bring in your used oil, used oil filters and oil containers (non commercial use only). This service is also offered free of charge throughout the year by the Municipality by appointment only. Thank you for your active participation in a healthy environment!

AÏKIBUDO VALCARTIER

L'AIKIBUDO is a martial art of Japanese origin. It is the inheritance of a very long tradition bequeathed by the samurai, the Japanese warriors of the feudal period.

The rigorous transmission of the various techniques and the understanding of the AIKIBUDO harmonizing efficiency, grace and flexibility make it an exceptional discipline.

The nature of the art forbids any form of sports competition. However, the techniques are applied realistically. So there are no opponents, but practice partners. All projections and keys, practised on the articulations, are applied with mastery.

AIKIBUDO is for everyone (women and men, 16 years and over), each progressing at his or her own rhythm. KOBUDO (weapons handling) is practiced as an educational discipline. The school to which we are affiliated is TENSHIN SHODEN KATORI SHINTO RYO.

The weapons used in the practice of this art are the Bokken (wood replica of a Samuraï saber), the Bo, the Tanto, the Tambo and the Naginata.

The return of salmon fishing on the Jacques-Cartier River?


The fishing of Atlantic salmon has been prohibited on the Jacques-Cartier River since 2004. However, the concerted efforts to reintroduce the species by the Corporation du basin de la Jacques-Cartier (CBJC) and the Ministry of Forests, Wildlife and Parks (MFFP) are giving hope to reverse the situation. Salmon run trends are on the rise and the dream of an eventual reopening of fishing is surfacing.

Given the evolving character of the waterway, the Jacques-Cartier riverbed has undergone modifications over the past 15 years. The CBJC, will attempt, over the summer season, to characterize the salmon pits that are used between the Fort Jacques-Cartier bridge and the Donnacona dam. These pits, where the salmon rest during their run (from June to October) are privileged areas where fishers can practice their art.

In order to characterize this essential habitat, the CBJC launched an Atlantic salmon experimental fishing project that will take place during the months of June to August this year. More precisely, for every day targeted by the project (10 in all) experienced volunteer fishers will carry out a scientific fish in 3 predefined sectors for a total duration of 1 hour per day per sector. This fishing experiment will be used as a way to document the area, the pit retention, the efficiency of the fly fishing etc. Information and data will be gathered, such as the number of salmon observed, and will be compiled and analyzed to determine the resting pit and guide future actions concerning the gradual reopening of salmon fishing all the while respecting ministerial regulation.

A CBJC employee will be present on site every day of the fishing experiment to explain to passers-by, the visitors and the curious, the reason for the experimental fishing project, the rules in place as well as the gathering of extra information etc. It is important to note that this scientific project has the authorization of the responsible authorities and that all salmon caught will be released back to the river.
