### Septic installations - tips

The Municipality provides the service to empty all septic tanks every two (2) years for residential and commercial septic tanks and every four (4) years for seasonal residences. The next service will be in 2021.

Until next summer the contractor hired for our municipality is SANI-CHARLEVOIX until May 31, 2021. They can be reached at 1-418-639-2731.

The cost to empty a septic tank outside of the regular operating period negotiated in their contract is \$175.00 for a regular emptying.

#### How to maximize the life of your septic system?

If your tank is fitted with a pre-filter, please make sure it is cleaned once a year. It is the responsibility of the owner to do so.

The primary treatment tank is used to clarify the wastewater by the decantation of suspended solids and the retention of floating material.

The biological activity (bacterial flora) present in the tank must be protected in order to avoid short term clogging of the system. In order to do so, it is essential to implement the following recommendations:

- Do not use additives in your tank.
- Use biodegradable toilet paper.
- Use a detergent with no phosphates.
- Use bleach in reasonable quantities.
- Never throw the following in your toilet or sink: facial tissue (Kleenex), cotton swabs (Q-tips), cigarette butts, sanitary napkins, wipes, condoms, oils, grease and paint.

#### Winter storms — garbage and recycling

The Public Works Department would like to draw your attention to a problem situation during winter storms. Several bins are broken or destroyed every winter when they are wrongly placed on the roadside during a storm. To fix this, the solution is simple: do not put out your bins during a storm if it is not ABSOLUTELY necessity. This simple habit would reduce replacement costs and give a hand to snow removers! ### **Special Christmas Tree Collection**

During the week of **January 4**, the Municipality will offer a special pick up of natural and artificial Christmas trees. There is

no need to sign up for this service but you must put your tree at the roadside for January 4, at the latest.

#### DID YOU KNOW THAT...

-IN ORDER TO FACILITATE SNOW REMOVAL OPERATIONS, IT IS FORBIDDEN TO DUMP SNOW ON PUBLIC ROADS OR ADJACENT LAND.

-IT IS FORBIDDEN FOR ANYONE TO PASS ON PRIVATE LAND, WITHOUT THE EXPRESS AUTHORIZATION OF THE OWNER, HIS REPRESENTATIVE OR OWNER OF THE PREMISES. THIS INCLUDES ALL OFF-ROAD VEHICLES.

### **Bulk garbage collection**

The Municipality will collect bulk waste on a weekly basis. This service functions on a call-in basis only, please do not deposit non-household waste in front of large refuse containers or community mailboxes. You must call 418 844-1218 to schedule this service or register on-line on the Municipality's Website, under the «Online request» section. When you call, please be ready to give us an itemized list of materials to be collected.

Note that this service is offered a maximum of 4 times per year, per

#### residence.

It is important that the materials to be collected by the Municipality be set out in an organized manner (ex: carpets must be rolled and tied, metal must be sorted, wire must be rolled and tied, etc.)

You may dispose of used tires (noncommercial use only) and rims. You can also dispose of used vegetable oil. Oil must be in its original container or in an identified clear plastic bottle.

Please note that vehicle carcasses or

frames, tree and brush debris, household garbage and leaves as well as recyclable materials will not be collected during the weekly collections.

For renovation materials, you may not dispose of these in your black garbage bin as the waste management company will not pick up your garbage. Major renovation materials should be disposed at the Stoneham Ecocentre 418 848-3134 (we suggest you call them for their opening hours).

### TIPS FOR THE HOLIDAYS



### **CHRISTMAS**

- Install your natural or artificial tree away from heat sources (baseboard, heater, fireplace, etc.)
- Place the tree in a container filled with water and water every day.
- Choose an artificial tree over a natural one to reduce fire hazards.



- Choose decorative lights approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or ULC. Verify that they are in good working order and install according to manufacturer's instructions.
- Turn off the lights before going to bed or leaving the house.



#### **CANDLES**

- Place candles on a stable surface and away from any flammable object.
- Keep out of reach of children and animals.
- Extinguish all candles before exiting a room or leaving the house.



### COOKING

- Keep a constant watch over food that is
- Do not store objects in the oven or on cooking surfaces.
- Keep children away from cooktop.
- Make sure to turn off cooking appliances before leaving the kitchen or the house.



#### **FONDUE POT BURNER**

- Place the burner on a stable, heatproof surface.
- Do not fill the burner when it is hot. Use a second burner instead.
- Choose an electric fondue pot instead.



#### **EXTENSION CORDS**

- Use extension cords approved by an organization such as CSA or ULC.
- Do not surcharge the electric circuit.
- Replace any damaged cords or cords emitting heat.



#### **PORTABLE ELECTRIC HEATING EQUIPMENT**

- Plug the appliance directly into the socket.
- Always use an appliance approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or ULC.
- Turn off at night or before leaving the



## OUTINGS AND ACCESS LANES

- Clear exits, balconies, terraces and windows of snow after every snowfall.
- Make sure that access lanes leading to exits are always cleared.



#### **ASHES**

- Let ashes cool down outside in a metallic container with a metallic cover.
- Wait at least seven days before transferring to a garbage bin.

#### Valcartier Churches

In the earliest days of "The Settlement", Presbyterian and Anglican services would have been held in homes and schools and served by visiting clergy. Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier is now home to four churches. St. Gabriel's Catholic Church began as a Mission with the building of a wooden chapel in 1832. It was located across the street from the present day church. In 1852, a red granite church was built and then replaced in 1912 by the present church, built on the same site as the former. St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church began in 1833 as a small wooden church located near the present church which was built in the early 1850's. Christ Church, Valcartier (Anglican), had its beginnings as a wooden church in 1844 and the present church was open to worship on Christmas Day in 1863. St. Andrew's United Church was established in 1925 when the United Church of Canada was formed through the unification of the Presbyterian, Congregational and Methodist churches.

#### A PEEK AT THE PAST

Here, as throughout the rest of Canada, some members of the Presbyterian Church decided to join the UCC, others choose to remain with the Presbyterian Church.

#### MEALS-ON-WHEELS AND OTHER SERVICES

The "Popote et Multi-Services" is a non-profit organization with a mission to support the elderly, frail or recovering to allow them to be able to stay safely in their homes as long as possible.

We offer **hot meal delivery** services at lunch time, whether you need it on a short or long-term basis, this service could help you and lighten your daily workload:

⇒ For a mere \$7 per meal, including a soup, meal and dessert, you don't have to clean up or do dishes. You could also be admissible (70 years old and over) to a Revenue Quebec tax credit for seniors.

We also offer **transportation and accompaniment** services for medical reasons, this service is not a taxi service, is assured by volunteers. You must simply compensate the volunteer for the reimbursement of their gas usage. The compensation goes entirely to the volunteer.

⇒ Fees vary from one area to another. For example, for Quebec hospitals, the cost is of \$30 and this includes the drive in and back, and in many cases, the parking fee.

Avoid having to worry about driving and parking costs and procedures.

If you would like to get involved as a volunteer either for meal deliveries or transportation and accompaniment, you are most welcome. Being a volunteer for the meals-on-wheels and other services, you will not incur any costs as a volunteer since we reimburse the mileage costs during the delivery of meals and that, for the transportation and accompaniment, 100 % of the compensation is returned to you.
