Message from the Mayor

Once again, the time has arrived to adopt our budget for the coming year. As usual, the members of council held several meetings with senior staff to analyze our position and the direction we want to take for the coming year. In 2021, we realized our major project with the roof over our skating rink. I think everyone will agree that the finished product is very spectacular, and we are very proud and pleased with the result.

Consequently, our total budget for 2022 is less than last year. The total budget for this year is \$ 7 607 270 and I am pleased to announce that our current tax rates will remain unchanged at \$ 0.34 for residential properties and \$0.47 for non-residential. We have been dealing with pandemic restrictions for two years now and we have tried to focus our resources on activities that can be enjoyed outdoors. The new skating rink as well as our skating path, our walking trail and the path linking us to Lac Delage (La Visite) fall into this category. This has allowed residents to have at least some social interaction during this trying period.

Five years ago, the Municipality entered into an agreement to rent a new building which houses our gym (Centre Physik) as well as the Historical committee. This facility has proved to be very popular. Our contract included an option to buy the property after five years and the municipal council has decided to exercise this option this year, making it our major project in 2022.



CLARK'S BRIDGE - DRIVERS! A CALL FOR CAUTION!

Dear fellow citizens, some residents have been telling us lately about a problem that occurs when pedestrians want to cross Clark's Bridge. With the park right next to the bridge, this area is heavily used by walkers. Summer or winter, it is a popular area!

It seems it is very dangerous to cross the bridge on foot, vehicles pass quickly and very close to pedestrians. Pedestrians have to hurry to get on the boards on each side of the bridge. These are not very wide and they are not designed to be a sidewalk, but a structural part of the bridge. In the winter, it is even more difficult because the sides are not always cleared of snow. It would be preferable to yield to pedestrians and allow them to pass safely. We therefore appeal to everyone to be courteous, to slow down and to give priority to pedestrians crossing the bridge.

2022 MUNICIPAL TAXES — PAYMENT METHODS

You will be receiving your Municipal tax bill at the beginning of March.

The payment of the general land tax, the surtax on non-residential immoveables, taxes and other compensations is to be made in a maximum of three (3) instalments. (Bills under \$300 must be paid in one payment).

The **first payment** must be made no later than **April 1st**, **2022**. The **second payment**, if applicable, is due by **July 1st**, **2022**. The **third and final payment**, if applicable, is due on **September 1st**, **2022**. Therefore if the first payment is late, even by a few days, the privilege to pay in three (3) instalments is forfeited. The total balance of the account will have to be paid immediately with interest.

Please pay your tax bill on time in order to avoid annual interest rates of 12% payable on all late payments.

You may pay your municipal taxes in cash (at the counter), by cheque (at the counter, by mail or through the night deposit), by Interac (at the counter), by Internet or at a financial institution ATM. For Internet payments, the reference number corresponds to your roll number excluding the first numbers (22025) and hyphens for a total of 10 numbers.

New Triennial Assessment Role 2022-2023-2024

As required by the Act Respecting Municipal Taxation, a new assessment roll was prepared by Altus Group, a firm of external evaluators mandated by the MRC de la Jacques-Cartier for property assessment work on its territory. This new roll is effective for the 2022, 2023 and 2024 fiscal years and, unless there are changes to the property, these values are valid for the duration of the triennial assessment roll.

The assessment roll is an inventory of the properties situated on the territory of a municipality and reflects the real value of each property based on its real value. The real value of a property corresponds to its exchange value on a free and open market. In other words, it is the price which a buyer would most likely accept to pay in a private sale, if that property were for sale. The value is established by considering real estate market conditions as of July 1st of the year preceding the filing of the roll, which is July 1st, 2020, for the roll deposited on October 8th, 2021.

To establish the real value, the Altus Group inspected and investigated the transactions registered on the territory over the past 3 years. These sales enabled the evaluator to establish calculation standards to be used to determine a value for all immovables of the municipality according to the characteristics of each property (usage, physical elements, quality of its components, etc.) as well as its location within the municipality.

To assess the physical state of the properties, the Act states that an evaluator must ensure the accuracy of the information in his/her possession at least once every nine years. During the last 3 years, Altus Group carried out many visits on the territory to ensure that each property of the territory had been visited since 2013. During these visits, the information that was gathered by the inspectors considered the quality of the maintenance of the property and improvements made without the issuing of renovation permits. The updating of these files, in certain cases, lead to the issuing of a Notice of modification to the assessment roll to adjust the current value and in other cases lead to a readjustment to the value solely as of January 1st, 2022.

In consequence, this exercise shows variations between the value registered on the previous roll and those registered on the new roll. Also, there may be differences between sectors and/or type of dwelling in the municipality, depending on the results of the equalization of the values to the conditions of the real estate market on the reference date (July 1st, 2020).

The value of the properties was established using the real estate transactions registered during the last three-years. The COVID-19 pandemic had an impact on the real estate market of the MRC de la Jacques-Cartier. The attraction for large properties (4 hectares and more) were coveted by buyers. A progression in sales prices was observed in the reference year (2020) and that this phenomenon continued into 2021. The impact of which will be measured in the next roll (2025-2027).

Roll Statistics

- Total value of immovables new roll 2022-2023-2024, all categories together, is established at \$997 967 700, an increase of \$53 829 500 or 5.7% compared to the previous assessment roll
- The average value of single-family residences increased 6.5% for an average value of \$327 973
- The real estate market recorded an average growth of 15.8% in residential land values.

The role of the evaluator

The evaluator has no impact on the budgets nor the method of taxation. The role of the evaluator is to ensure that each property is assessed in an equitable manner. The assessment roll is used by the municipality or the school board to equitably distribute the fiscal tax burden according to the services provided.

May one contest the new value on the assessment roll?

Yes. The application for review must be made between the deposit of the new assessment roll and <u>before May 1st of the first fiscal year</u> of the roll, which is, before May 1st, 2022. After which, the right to revision no longer exists.

According to article 129 of the Act Respecting Municipal Taxation, a taxpayer who wishes to apply for revision of a new assessment must do so using the prescribed form. The taxpayer will be required to express a value and explain the reasoning behind said value. The form is available at the municipal office or on the municipal website (www.saint-gabriel-devalcartier.ca) and must be duly completed and sent to the MRC de la Jacques-Cartier (60, rue St-Patrick, Shannon (Québec) G3S 1P8) accompanied by the prescribed amount.

Winter storms and garbage and recycling



The Public Works Department would like to draw your attention to a problematic situation during winter storms. Several bins are broken or destroyed every winter when they are wrongly placed on the roadside during a storm. To resolve this, several solutions are possible:

- Place bins in the driveway, at the edge of the curbside not on the roadside:
- Bring in your bins as soon as possible after they've been emptied;
- Avoid putting out your bins if they are not full.

These simple habits would reduce replacement costs and give a hand to snow removers!

FAULTY STREET LIGHTS

If you notice a faulty street light within the limits of the Municipality, please call **418 844-1218** and leave the coordinates of the faulty light.

Please note that repairs are carried out every two weeks.

Risk of frozen waterpipes and waterlines

Preventive notice—Important risk of freeze to municipal and private pipes and water lines

Even if we are experiencing milder weather, frost goes deep and can still cause the pipes to freeze. Some people are more at risk to sustain damages from frozen pipes.

Here are a few examples:

- Prior water main freezing;
- Underground conduit located under a cleared surface (driveway, sidewalk...);
- Property uninhabited for a prolonged period of time;
- Unheated or barely heated utility basement.

If one or more of these conditions apply to your property, please take the necessary precautions to avoid the freezing of your water line. In addition, we strongly suggest that you let a trickle of water flow (the size of a pencil) to allow a constant circulation in the pipes.



Blk Waste Collection

The Municipality will collect bulk waste on a weekly basis. Please do not deposit non-household waste in front of large refuse containers or community mailboxes. You must call 418 844-1218 to schedule this service or register on-line on the Municipality's Website, under the «On-line request» section. When you call, please be ready to give us an itemized list of materials to be collected.

Note that this service is offered a maximum of 4 times per year, per residence.

It is important that the materials to be collected by the Municipality be set out in an organized manner (ex: carpets must be rolled and tied, metal must be sorted, wire must be rolled and tied, etc.)

You may dispose of used tires (noncommercial use only) and rims. You can also dispose of used vegetable oil. Oil must be in its original container or in an identified clear plastic bottle.

Please note that vehicle carcasses or frames, tree and brush debris, household garbage and leaves as well as recyclable materials will not be collected during the weekly collections.

You may dispose of your bulk waste and renovation materials at the Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier Ecocenter (2329 Boulevard Valcartier). It is open on Saturdays from 8 am to 12 pm (noon). You may not dispose of these in your black garbage bin as the waste management company will not pick up your oarbage.

A PEEK AT THE PAST

The Heart of Nature – Agriculture

Although the soil in the Jacques Cartier Valley is not ideal for agriculture, and the number of frost-free days

is not advantageous, the land, none the less, supported an early population and is still supporting an agricultural economy. In the early days, each farm grew food and raised animals to meet the family's needs. Later, when transportation became easier, "extras" were sold in the neighbouring villages and even in Quebec City, although a trip to the city would have been a full day ordeal. In the 1920s, some farmers were also raising foxes for pelts and small-scale turkey farming found its beginnings. At first, a small number of black turkeys were raised primarily for the Christmas trade. Later, they were replaced by white turkeys and the number of turkeys increased steadily. Today, with approximately 500,000 turkeys representing sales that approach ten million dollars, Valcartier represents 20% of the provincial turkey production.





HERALDIC EMBLEMS—COAT OF ARMS

In 2016, the municipal council made the decision to initiate the process to receive the heraldic emblems from the Crown of Canada under the powers exercised by the Governor General. Here is the first part of the coat of arms and its description. **Green and gold** are the emblematic colours of the municipality. Green also symbolizes nature and gold, sunny days, thus pointing out that Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier is a great place to live in with many green spaces.

The golden triangle on a green background suggests the geographic location of the municipality in the Jacques-Cartier River Valley, as well as the letter V for « Valcartier » and the name of the Canadian Armed Forces base located in the region.

The four-loop knot interlaced with a ring forms a compass rose. Symbolizing harmony and journeys, this type of Celtic knot represents here the municipality's sense of community and the exploration that led to its establishment. Furthermore, the cross formed by the four loops alludes to the municipality's history, the land having been first a Jesuits' property, then bought by four business men from the City of Québec, and finally organized in parishes.

The winged sextant is a visual interpretation of the municipality's name, the wings representing the Archangel Gabriel and the sextant, the French explorer Jacques Cartier. The wings also symbolize poultry, an important regional industry.

The yellow birch stands for local flora. Its splitting in two branches represents the bilingualism and solidarity that characterize the community, as well as its strong respect for nature.

The mural crown is a symbol of municipal authority.

The red poppy is a military symbol and it highlights the presence of the Canadian Armed Forces base Valcartier on the municipality's territory.

À L'UNISSON - AT NATURE'S TEMPO

Meaning "In unison at nature's tempo," this phrase combining words in French and in English highlights the community's bilingualism, harmony and rural lifestyle.

The turkeys represent white turkey farming, the main industry in the region.

The mounds, representing hills, and the **river** symbolize the regional geographical features, which are ideal for outdoor sports and make Saint-Gabriel-de-Valcartier a year-round destination for active travellers.

The log recalls the prominent role played by timber driving in the community's history.

The blue flag, the thistle flower and the clover symbolize respectively the municipality's province of Quebec, and the Scottish and the Irish settlers who established the community in the early 19th century.

The flag repeats the symbolism of the shield.

BACKYARD BIRDS—The Downy woodpecker

Surprisingly, there are over 198 species of woodpeckers in the world and 13 of these live in Canada. The best known of this species is undoubtedly the Downy woodpecker. In order to recognize the Downy woodpecker, this one is black and white and has a wide white stripe down the middle of its back. Small black and white tiles are outlined under its wings and its crown is black. Both male and female are roughly the same size but the male has a small scarlet-red patch, just like a red pompom behind the crown.

The Downy woodpecker looks a lot like the Hairy woodpecker but the Hairy woodpecker is bigger and in fact, you almost need to see both at the same time to better differentiate them but regular birders will recognize them by their beaks; while the Downy has a shorter beak than its head and the Hairy's beak is as long if not longer than its head.

The Downy woodpecker has the ability to dig holes in wood because of its straight, chiselshaped beak made of solid bone. Its nostrils are covered with small feathers to prevent

wood chips and dust from entering it. Its long and hairy tongue allows it to scavenge for food in crevices and behind bark. Like most woodpeckers, the Downy woodpecker is a climber. Its short legs with four toes; two facing forward and two facing back, allow him to grip securely.

The Downy woodpecker is an insectivore; therefore, it feeds most of the time on insects that fly or live in hiding; ants, moths and caterpillars are his primary food sources but in winter, plants, seeds and frozen berries take an important part of his diet and the little Downey will willingly go to feeders with suet blocks or peanut butter.

From February or March, a pair of Downey woodpeckers will signal to their entourage that they are taking possession of its nesting territory by browsing it and drumming their beaks on branches or other sound objects. You may have heard him drumming on your tin roof or wall; this is his way of marking his territory.

It is mostly the male who digs the nest while the female flies around and hunts intruders. The female will lay between 4 and 6 white eggs and both parents will

take turns to warm the eggs every 15-30 minutes. The incubation will last just about 12 days until they hatch. The chicks weigh around 1.6 g and the parents will continue to warm them up as they did with the eggs occasionally bringing in small insects to feed them until they almost reach their adult size around the age of 17-18 days...Pretty fast, isn't it! At 5 weeks of age, they are able to be self-sufficient.

Among the predators of this little woodpecker is the American Kestrel, the Sharp-shinned hawk and the Cooper's Hawk but squirrels of all sorts as well as garden snakes will feed on the eggs if they are able to penetrate the cavity that serves as a nest.

The Downey woodpecker lives where there are trees and mixed forests and we are therefore blessed in our municipality to have such an abundance of trees of all kinds that serve well this little woodpecker. Fir, spruce and maple trees, fruit trees and shrubs wild or planted and even from time to time, small logs installed on poles with peanut butter, all to make its visibility easily accessible to our eyes.

This curious little woodpecker is among us all year round so get outside, make some nice discoveries and try to see the difference between the Downy woodpecker and the Hairy woodpecker which will be in an upcoming column.



We offer **hot meal delivery services** at lunch time, whether you need it on a short or long-term basis, this service could help you and lighten your daily workload:

For a mere \$7 per meal, including a soup, meal and dessert, you don't have to clean up or do dishes. You could also be admissible (70 years old and over) to a Revenue Quebec tax credit for seniors.

We also offer transportation and accompaniment services for medical reasons, this service is not a taxi service but is assured by volunteers. You must simply compensate the volunteer for the reimbursement of their gas usage.

Fees vary from one area to another. For example, for

Quebec hospitals, the cost is of \$30 round-trip, and in many cases, the parking fee.

Avoid having to worry about driving and parking costs and procedures.

RINK AND SKATING PATH

The skate locker room is open from 10:00 am to 9:00 pm, Sunday to Thursday and from 10:00 am to 10:00 pm on Fridays and Saturdays. Please note that the rink is reserved on Tuesday evenings from 8:00 pm to 9:30 pm for the adult friendly hockey league, a leisure activity organized in collaboration with the Municipality, and on Sunday mornings for skating lessons from 8:30 am to 11 am. The skating path remains accessible during the activities organized on the rink. The hours may change without notice according to changes in sanitary measures
