MUNICIPAL TAXES

Final payment of 2023 municipal taxes

We remind you that the third and final payment is due on September 1st, 2023, after which, interest fees will apply.

Payment methods:

In cash (at the counter), by cheque made in the name of Municipalité de Saint-Gabrielde-Valcartier (at the counter, by mail or in the night deposit box), by debit payment (at the counter) and by Internet or at the ATM at your financial institution.

The 2024 annual tax bill will be mailed the first week of March.

2023 MUNICIPAL SEPTIC TANK EMPTYING PROGRAM

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:


- Take careful note of the schedule (The Indispensable Bulletin, mailings, website);
- Due to the complexity of the schedule/operation, **no accommodation is possible**. If necessary, request the assistance of a neighbour or other person;
- The operator can refuse to offer the service if covers are not cleared properly and in depth as well the handles
 on each side or if there are obstructions of any kind. Fees are charged for a 2nd visit when caused by neglect to
 follow procedures.

The Municipality is responsible for the emptying of septic tanks on its territory. Note that this service is offered by the Municipality without additional costs under certain conditions. In conformity with the current provincial By-Law on the matter (Q-2, r.22), a septic tank used year-round must be emptied every 2 years and every 4 years for a septic tank used on a seasonal basis.

A regular septic waste collection, combined with a quality construction of your septic system and proper maintenance, will allow it to be used to its full potential, maximize its useful life and protect your investment. Just type "Guide des bonnes pratiques systèmes septiques" in Google to obtain the Ministry of Environment's Guide des bonnes pratiques (All information available in French only).

Provincial regulation Q-2, R22

We would like to remind you that any secondary, advanced secondary or tertiary type septic system must be contracted at all times with the manufacturer of the system, it's representative or a qualified third party with the stipulation that a minimum annual maintenance of the system will be carried out.

The owner must file a copy of the contract with the Municipality as well as a copy of the inspection report before December 31 of each year. Penalties of \$ 1000 can be given to the offender.

What is an Ecocentre?

An Ecocentre is available for residents who want to dispose of products, materials and substances that are not accepted in the garbage or recycling collection. An ecocentre is not a dump site.

These materials are recovered and recycled so that their component materials can be recovered. In the case of materials that cannot be recycled, the Municipality ensures that they are disposed of in a healthy and environmentally responsible manner.

The items you bring to the Ecocentre are not reused. If you wish to have them reused, you must contact a recycling centre.

What can I bring to the Ecocentre?

- Household hazardous waste HHW (oils, paints, batteries, light bulbs containing mercury (hg)
- Tires and rims
- Dry materials (asphalt shingles, mixed wood, mixed gypsum, mineral wool and derivatives, plastics, mixed polystyrene, construction materials)
- Branches, landfill, leaves, concrete, stumps
- Textiles (couches, mattresses, upholstered or patio furniture, rugs, canvas, tarps)
- Metals (appliances, sheet metal, pipes, etc.)
- Electronic devices.

What materials are not accepted?

- Household waste (anything you might throw away in your household garbage)
- Recyclable materials (anything that goes in your recycling bin)
- Contaminated soil
- Commercial and industrial materials, products and objects are not accepted (including oversized tires)
- Explosive materials
- Dead animals
- Medical waste (medications, syringes, etc.)

Instructions to be respected:

- Children and pets must remain in the vehicle at all times
- Make sure you arrive at least one hour before the Ecocentre closes to allow time to unload your materials
- When you arrive, list the materials you are bringing to the attendant who will tell you where to put them
- You can bring up to 5 cubic meters of material per visit
- Proof of residence is required
- Materials deemed too bulky may be refused at the site.

CIVIC LIFE

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED FOR...

Any construction, addition or implantation of a structure, septic system or groundwater collection system; or any enlargement, alteration, modification, repair, reconstruction or renovation of an existing structure, part of a structure or septic system or groundwater collection system (including the addition of an extra bedroom in a residence or, in the case of another building, an increase in the capacity of operation or use), is prohibited without first obtaining a building permit .

However, a building permit is not required for the following:

- A dog house (for non-commercial purposes);
- A pergola or a gazebo;
- A small prefabricated storage building with a maximum floor area of 6 m2 (8' x 8')
- A heating oil or propane gas tank for non-commercial purposes;
- An amateur radio antenna or digital antenna;
- A removable private playground equipment (ex.: module, trampoline, basketball hoop, etc.) (residential lot), noncommercial;
- An outdoor fireplace (independent of the main building);
- A clothesline;
- A vegetable garden, a garden;
- A swimming pool with a water depth of less than 60 centimeters and which does not have a filtration system;
- A residential parking lot;
- Landscaping including a border, hedge, tree, shrub but excluding walls and fences;
- Temporary constructions (ex.: snow fence, winter shelter, etc.);
- Usual maintenance work (e.g.: painting, staining);
- The repair or replacement (partial or total) of an exterior component of a construction (e.g.: exterior siding of walls, roof, door, window, staircase), on the condition that it retains the same surface area and dimension;
- The repair or replacement (partial or total) of an interior component of a construction (e.g.: floor covering, bathroom, kitchen cabinet), on the condition that the same surface area, the same dimension, the same structure, the same partitions are maintained.

Note: In the case where a construction permit is not required, the applicable provisions contained in the urbanism by-laws must still be respected.

SPECIAL LEAF COLLECTION

<u>Bags of leaves</u> will not be picked up during the regular weekly collection of household garbage. The Municipality will organize a special collection the **week of October 30**. Bags of leaves should be placed by the side of the road in front of your residence. No reservation required.



STRAY CATS AND DOGS



We would like to remind you that all dogs and cats must be kept on a leash or in an enclosure inside your property. An animal outside its property could be recovered by the SPA, custody fees would apply and fines would be given.

At certain times of the year, the Municipality has wood chips to distribute. If you wish to receive some, make a request by calling 418 844-1218.



WINTER SHELTERS

Winter shelters for either vehicles or for pedestrians at the entrance of a building, as well as snow fences and other winter protection are authorized in all zones from **October 1 to April 30** of the following year.

A PEEK AT THE PAST

BETTY'S QUILTERS

by Joyce McCartney, a member of Betty's Quilters since 2000

Like many rural Quebec communities, quilting has been an important part of the culture in our community. In the early days, it was a question of necessity when our ancestors collected used garments and cloth to recycle them into a new form, a patchwork quilt.

Mothers would sew in their own homes and would often come together as a group, known as a Quilting Bee, to help each other finish a quilt. Church basements and halls would also have been used for this purpose. Many of us have memories of our grandmothers making quilts and some may be the lucky recipient of a precious heirloom. Eventually quilters in Valcartier were fortunate to have

Eventually quilters in Valcartier were fortunate to have access to the Community Centre where they could set up in a large room. In 1980, quilting classes were started in the basement of the facility where quilting groups met sporadically until the mid 1990s when Betty Montgomery Tremblay returned to live in Valcartier. It wasn't long before she began sharing her quilting and gardening skills with family and friends. She organized small quilting groups who met occasionally. During the late 1990s, a group of about a dozen ladies were meeting regularly under Betty's guidance. By the year 2000, the local group was expanding.

During the following year, 2001, Betty was diagnosed with cancer and couldn't meet with the group as often. In her absence, her "students" collectively made her a quilt. It was presented to her with a signed label: "Hope you're feeling better, Betty's Quilters." Sadly, Betty passed away in 2002. It was at that moment that the quilting members officially named their group "Betty's Quilters."

At present, 20 active members share their unique expertise and experience. The social dynamic and atmosphere within the group is very positive and friendly. Members meet every Monday at the Community Centre, 9 am to 3 pm, from September to May. Newcomers are always welcome. The highlight of each quilting year is Betty's Quilting Exhibition.


