

WINTER PARKING

The Municipality would like to remind you that streetside parking is not permitted at any time during the winter season under penalty of law.



FIRE PREVENTION SERVICE

With winter already upon us, we need to keep in mind that the heating appliances we use carry certain risks.



For wood heating, it's important

to remember to sweep the chimney at least once a year, including the connecting pipe between the stove and the chimney. It's often in this part of the chimney that creosote deposits build up, causing chimney fires.

It's also important to remember that all combustion heating appliances, whether wood stoves, propane fireplaces or oil furnaces, can produce carbon monoxide (CO) fumes inside buildings. If you own such an appliance, we recommend you install a CO alarm. It can be plugged into a wall socket, or battery-powered, ceiling-mounted like a smoke alarm. Combined smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are also available, making them a very attractive option.

Using a Generator

Bad weather regularly brings us power outages. The use of a generator is now very widespread but carries risks of fire and poisoning by its exhaust gases. Here are some rules to follow for the safe use of a generator.

- Read and follow the manufacturer's instructions
- Have a qualified technician connect your generator to your home's electrical system through its panel and transfer switch.
- Place the generator outside, in a ventilated area and away from doors and windows (not in a garage). You will prevent exhaust gases from entering your home.
- Make sure it is firmly fixed on the ground

TIPS FOR THE HOLIDAYS



CHRISTMAS TREE

- Install your natural or artificial tree away from heat sources (baseboard, heater, fireplace, etc.)
- Place the tree in a container filled with water and water every day.
- Choose an artificial tree over a natural one to reduce fire hazards.



CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

- Choose decorative lights approved by organization such as CSA or ULC. Ensure they are in good working order and install according to manufacturer's instructions.
- Turn off the lights before going to bed or leaving the house.



CANDLES

- Place candles on a stable surface and away from any flammable object.
- Keep out of reach of children and animals.
- Extinguish all candles before exiting a room or leaving the house.



HOLIDAY COOKING

- Keep a constant watch over food that is cooking.
- Do not store objects in the oven or on cooking surfaces.
- Keep children away from cooktop.
- Make sure to turn off cooking appliances before leaving the kitchen or the house.



FONDUE POT BURNER

- Place the burner on a stable, heatproof surface.
- Do not fill the burner when it is hot. Use a second burner instead.
- Choose an electric fondue pot instead.



EXTENSION CORDS

- Use extension cords approved by an organization such as CSA or ULC.
- Do not surcharge the electric circuit.
- Replace any damaged cords or cords



PORTABLE ELECTRIC HEATING EQUIPMENT

- Plug the appliance directly into the
- Always use an appliance approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or



OUTINGS AND ACCESS LANES

- Clear exits, balconies, terraces and windows of snow after every snowfall.
- Make sure that access lanes leading to exits are always cleared.



ASHES

- Let ashes cool down outside in a metallic container with a metallic cover.
- Wait at least seven days before transferring to a garbage bin.

Recycling

Sorting residual materials at home is a simple way for anyone to do their part for the environment. In fact, it's the key to effective recycling, as it enables us to get our waste to the right places, thus facilitating the work of the sorting centers and the recovery process.

Here's a reminder of what goes in your blue bin:

- Unsoiled paper and cardboard
- **Plastics**
- Glass containers
- Metal and aluminum

Did you know that the municipal offices have drop-off points for certain materials that don't fit in your blue bin?

You can drop off:

- **Batteries**
- Ink cartridges
- Old cell phones and their rechargeable batteries

WHAT CAN BE BROUGHT TO THE ECOCENTRE?

Hazardous household waste HHW (oils, paint, batteries, lightbulbs containing mercury (hg)

Tires and rims

Dry material (asphalt shingles, mixed wood, mixed gypsum, mineral wool and derivatives, plastics, mixed polystyrene, building materials)

Branches, debris, leaves, concrete, stumps

Textiles (sofas, mattresses, upholstered furniture or patio furniture, carpets, canvas, tarps, etc.)

Metals (appliances, sheet metal, pipes, etc..)

Electronic appliances (camera, computer and screen, etc.)

Best practices for your septic installation

To maximize the life of your septic system and avoid costly breakdowns, certain products should not be flushed down your toilet or sink. Some of them can interfere with the operation of your system by affecting the bacteriological activity (bacterial flora) present in the tank, and in a relatively short time lead to clogging of the treatment system. For this reason, the following recommendations are essential:

- Clean your prefilter at least once a year.
- Do not use additives in your pit.
- Use biodegradable toilet paper.
- Use a phosphate-free detergent.
- Use bleach in reasonable quantities.

Never flush paper, Kleenex, paper towels, Q-tips, cigarette butts, sanitary napkins, wipes, diapers or condoms down the toilet or sink.

Be alert!

As the owner of a septic system, it's your responsibility to make sure it's working properly and that no contaminants are being released into the environment.

Increased greenness, spongy soil or water leaks in your septic system, unpleasant odours and slow evacuation of water from your home may be signs of a defect or breakdown. When this happens, it's important to contact a professional and, if necessary, schedule the necessary repairs.

Septic System Maintenance Reminder

Carrying out annual maintenance on your septic system will ensure its proper operation and minimize risks to your health and the environment. It is the responsibility of every owner or user to ensure that their system is properly maintained, and that any parts that have reached the end of their service life are replaced.

Do you own an advanced secondary or tertiary treatment system? The Bylaw for sewage disposal and treatment for isolated residences requires you to be bound at all times by a valid contract with the system manufacturer, representative or a qualified third party. This contract ensures annual system maintenance and minimizes the risks associated with septic system failure. Remember to renew your maintenance contract if you haven't already done so!

Cesspools: what do the regulations say?

If your home was built before August 12, 1981, you may have a cesspool. Provincial regulations allow some tolerance for cesspools built before that date, provided they are not a source of nuisance and do not discharge wastewater into the environment. The pollutants in wastewater can contaminate groundwater and wells, endangering your health and the health of others. That's why it's the responsibility of every cesspool owner to ensure that it is working properly. There are no acquired rights when it comes to insalubrity, nuisance and pollution.

PUBLIC WORKS

Winter Storms—Garbage and Recycling

The Public Works Department would like to draw your attention to a problematic situation during winter storms. Several bins are broken or destroyed every winter when they are wrongly placed on the roadside during a storm. To fix this, the solution is simple: do not put out your bins during a storm unless it is ABSOLUTELY necessary to do so. This simple habit would reduce replacement costs and give a hand to snow removers! Thank you for your collaboration!

Special Christmas Tree Collection

During the weeks of January 1 and 8, the Municipality will offer a special pick up of natural and artificial Christmas trees. No need to sign up for this service but you must put your tree at the roadside for January 4, at the latest.

Bulk Waste Collection

The Municipality will collect bulk waste on a weekly basis. This service functions on a call-in basis only, please do not deposit non-household waste in front of large refuse containers or community mailboxes. You must call 418 844 -1218 to schedule this service or register on-line on the Municipality's Website, under the «On-line request» section. When you call, please be ready to give us an itemized list of materials to be collected.

Note that this service is offered a maximum of 4 times per year, per residence.

You can dispose of renovation materials at the Ecocentre (see P. 6). You can't dispose of them in regular garbage bins, as the contractor won't pick them up.

Backyard Birds—Maureen Bédard, councillor

PINE GROSBEAK

With the first snow on our doorstep, if it hasn't arrived yet, I thought I would write about a bird that we frequently see in our region throughout the winter.

The PINE grosbeak is a species of bird in the Fringillidae family, just as the evening grosbeak.

The male is of a pinkish colour whereas the female and immature are greyer and olive yellow. This bird measures approximately 24 cm and has a wingspan of more or less 32 cm with a weight of between 45 and 75 grams. Its abdomen and sides are grey and the beak and legs are black. The tail is quite long, black and a little forked while its beak is very robust, conical and slightly hooked.

The Pine grosbeak is present in northern Quebec in summer but during the winter, frequents our regions where it will discover our feeders, trays and all the small fruit trees with frozen fruits which they simply love.

Its nest is usually built in the fork of a tree with twigs, grass and moss. The female will lay between four and five blue-green eggs spotted with brown dots and circles. She will nest over the eggs for about two weeks and the chicks will begin to fly about three weeks after hatching while both parents continue to feed them for several more days until they are independent.





The Pine grosbeak is a discreet bird during the breeding season but very confident in winter, spending long periods of time at our feeders, on the snow or near shrubs picking and eating small frozen fruits. We can regularly see it feeding on the mountain ash trees which are abundant here. This colourful bird has a habit of bathing in the snow, directly on the ground, shaking its plumage to sprinkle itself with snow, exactly as it would with water, while waving its wings and tail.

The Pine grosbeak is a magnificent bird with beautiful colours to brighten our long winter days; revive your seed platters with frozen fruits and take the opportunity to make your observations as we have them in abundance in Valcartier. Happy observations!

MANDATORY ONLINE REGISTRATION ON THE VOILA! PORTAL

- Go to the Voilà! citizen portal at the following address: https://saint-gabriel-de-valcartier.appvoila.com/fr/?returnURL=%252Faccueil
- 2. In the registration area, click on « register ».
- 3. Fill out the form on-line to create your Custom Citizen Account.
- 4. Check the « I am interested in signing up for recreation programs » box.
- 5. You will receive an E-mail confirming the activation of your Custom Citizen Account. There may be a delay before the Recreation account is approved by an administrator. If this is the case, come back later to complete the registrations.

TO REGISTER ON THE RECREATION PLATFORM

- 1. Once you have received confirmation that your file has been activated, return to the Voilà! citizen portal and enter your email address and password in the "Sign in" area.
- 2. Click on "Log in".
- 3. Click on the "Recreation" button.
- 4. Register for the 2024 Winter Program activities as of December 26, 2023.

Remember that you must have created your citizen account before proceeding to this step, you will receive your confirmation email from the administration to access it.

We also offer transportation and accompaniment services for medical reasons, this service is not a taxi service, is assured by volunteers. You must simply compensate the volunteer for the reimbursement of their gas usage. The compensation goes entirely to the volunteer

⇒ Fees vary from one area to another. For example, for Quebec hospitals, the cost is \$30 and this includes the drive in and back, and in many cases, the parking fee.

Avoid having to worry about driving and parking costs and procedures.

If you would like to get involved as a volunteer either for meal deliveries or transportation and accompaniment, you are most welcome.
