

WINTER STREET PARKING

In order to avoid any inconvenience during the winter season, the Municipality would like to remind you of a few regulations that may help the snow removal process.

By-Law No. 120

Article 8.1: Parking of Vehicles on Public Roads

We would like to remind you that:

"Except in cases of major breakdowns, no one may park, abandon, or immobilize a motor vehicle in such a way that it may hide signage, impede traffic, road maintenance or snow removal or block access to a street or property." (Under penalty of law).

Article 11.1: Nuisance

In addition to a penalty of law (fine) the police or any person mandated by the municipal council may



order the removal of any vehicle parked in such a way that it may impede traffic, road works, including road maintenances or snow removal; and may therefore order the towing of this vehicle.

Article 12: Fine

All infractions to the present by-law renders the offender liable to pay a minimum fine of \$30.00 plus costs.

Nobody wants to have to experience these situations but together we can all help each other and that's what our citizens showed us during this last occasion. Some of you brought water or supplies to the most needy, while others opened their doors and homes to their neighbors.

Some even offered to transport neighbours who would need it in case of an evacuation.

Bravo! This only proves once again that we are all « Together, in the heart of Nature ». A very appropriate motto for our community.

MUNICIPAL SNOW REMOVAL **POLICY**

All local roads within the Municipality (except 5th Avenue and Boulevard Valcartier) are treated as follows:

The roads are cleared so as to maintain snow packed driving lanes treated with an abrasive (sand) at critical areas only.

Critical areas are sectors requiring special attention such as curbs, hills. intersections,

bridges or any other section of road which might present special conditions.



MESSAGE FROM THE SQ

Operation VACCIN 2016: Police services and the SAAQ joining forces to battle driving under the influence of drugs and alcohol

Police operations aimed at impaired driving due to drugs or alcohol will intensify from November 24th, 2016 to January 2nd, 2017 on the entire territory of Québec within the framework of Operation VACCIN, which signifies 'Verification accrue de la capacité de conduit – Intervention nationale'.

During targeted roadside checks, the police officers will distribute stickers bearing the slogan 'Impaired driving is criminal!'. This memory aid that drivers can put on their vehicles, will remind road users of the possible consequences to a bad decision.

Spontaneous interceptions by patrollers will be conducted intensely in order to detect and stop people whose driving ability is impaired. Remember that police officers use different techniques and tools to detect drugs and alcohol among drivers.

Prevent your loved ones from driving if they have been drinking

As a natural partner of the police force, the SAAQ is taking advantage of this period to launch a new awareness campaign. With this campaign, the police force and the SAAQ would like to encourage the population to intervene to prevent a loved one from taking the wheel if necessary. How can it be done? You could:

- Pay for a taxi
- Take their keys
- Insist as a group

· A helmet, full-face guard and neck guard

- Smoke on ice surfaces
- Launch slap shots or do body checks
- Push or shove
- Consume alcoholic beverages or drugs on municipal grounds
- Bring an animal on ice surfaces



SALMON HUSBANDRY ON THE JACQUES-CARTIER RIVER: 2016, A VERY GOOD YEAR FOR THE SALMON IN THE JACQUES-

CARTIER RIVER

A sign that autumn is at our door, the Atlantic salmon of the Jacques-Cartier River are showing off their most beautiful colours and are reaching their spawning sites. For the Corporation du basin de la Jacques-Cartier (CBJC), fall is the time to prepare the first results. In this sense, 2016 was a particularly favourable year for the salmon of the Jacques-Cartier River.

For the third year in a row, and the last before the reconstruction of the Donnacona dam, the adult salmon was captured in pits at the bottom of the McDougall dam in Pont-Rouge to be then transported close to their spawning sites. In all, 609 individual, or 404 large salmon, were brought upstream. The results were very encouraging as 2016 is the second largest occurrence recorded since 2000.

Another study conducted earlier this spring estimated the number of descending smelts in the river, which is to say that those that went downstream to reach their feeding grounds. In 2016, the percentage of survival (eggs and smelts) is estimated at 3.4%

which is higher than the percentage observed in the controlled rivers of the North Shore and Gaspé (1.5%). The Jacques-Cartier River salmon resource is doing well, but the total number of individuals is still below the conservation threshold.

Finally, an electric fishing sampling was carried out in the Jacques-Cartier River downstream of Pont-Rouge, a section of the river considered uncertain regarding reproduction since the beginning of the Jacques-Cartier salmon reintroduction effort. The results confirm that, since the break-up of the Donnacona dam, spawners have reproduced there. Unfortunately, the very low abundance of fingerlings found (2 in 2 years) seems to confirm the thesis that this area is not conducive to breeding. The CBJC would like to thank all those involved in one or another of these

projects and without whom their realization would have been impossible: the Atlantic Salmon Conservation Foundation (FCSA), the Society R.S.P. Énergie Inc., the Wildlife Heritage Foundation, the Ministry of Wildlife and Parks (Capitale-Nationale Direction and Wildlife

Management), our volunteers, and the Department of Biology at Université Laval for the loan of their equipment
